

WHILE WE'RE AT IT ...

Dear Friends,

It can seem like the tragedies just keep on adding up – hurricanes and earthquakes and floods we call "natural" disasters but still take a huge toll.

But then there are the "man-made disasters" such as the massacre in Las Vegas that defy explanation. It would be shocking and staggering if it were just a stand-alone incident but instead we seem to have such outbursts of inhuman attacks more and more frequently – from Columbine to Sandy Hook to Orlando and so many others.

And in another category altogether are Islamic terrorists who look to promote their twisted ideology by randomly slaughtering Muslim and Christian alike.



Our reactions to the savagery run the gamut between fear, grief, outrage, anger, despair, hatred, a thirst for vengeance... and all those reactions are understandable. But in responding, we must not become barbarians ourselves.

Perhaps the word "diabolical" is the most appropriate label for all of these events. Sacred Scripture presents the devil as the "father of lies" who roams the earth seeking the ruin of souls. He sows division and hatred, discord, violence, and cares about nothing but our destruction.

Most people today no longer believe in the devil as real, and dismiss the scriptural accounts as superstitious, old-fashioned - from a less enlightened age in history.

Let me suggest that we recover a healthy realism: that the devil truly is the cause of so much human evil and suffering. He is real, and he is our mortal enemy. And when we freely choose evil and sin it only makes him stronger and more powerful in the world.

I don't know if the devil was directly responsible for the carnage in Las Vegas. What I do know is we need to renounce Satan and all his works. We say that at our Baptism, but we need to renounce him "and all his works" every single day.

The Bible and the Church have always taught us: Jesus Christ is the only Son of God, and King of the Universe. He is Almighty. By his death and resurrection has broken the power of the devil. The devil and his evil cannot win in the end.

But we must obey the Lord and trust in him and commit our lives totally to him. He is the answer to our human condition of brokenness and the chaos of this world. He is the "way, the truth, and the life". In Him we place our trust, and we shall not be put to shame.







AN INSIDER: ADORATION HOLY HOUR

When I joined the parish a couple of years ago, there was a checklist form for ministries. I felt like checking nothing. That seemed safe! But Adoration caught my eye. Do you remember the scripture, "So, could you not watch with me one hour?" Even at the extreme of tortured anxiety, our Lord wanted companionship. Couldn't I spend an hour telling God how much I appreciate Him? He wants our communing. Yet we feel somehow driven to avoid it.

I say "we" to make myself feel better about the fact that I just did not want to step into the Adoration chapel. Isn't the magnificent crucifix in the alcove special enough? For 2000 years the cross has provided "the peace that passes all understanding." And it seemed so strange for the Host to be separate from the dynamic of the Mass, whereby we become part of the body of Christ. I dreaded the disengagement and isolation of the chapel, I dreaded the "Be still and know that I am God," I dreaded my own cluelessness.

Then by the grace of God, Mrs. Nastasi, as she is known to hundreds of little children, was my table leader for a spirituality class. She decided one day that we go to the chapel. So off we went, like All-Stars but not so cute. Under her eye, I sat there for 10 minutes, and lived! Next, I wanted to go "all by self," as my granddaughter would say. Next, I signed up like an adult for a regular hour. Now I can't get over it: the Presence of the Eternal Christ hidden in what looks like a humble, ordinary wafer, available right here in Brewster. **St. Therese and Her Little Way** *Rev. John F. Russell, O.Carm. Seton Hall University*

St. Therese believed that the people of her time lived in great fear of Gods judgment. The fear was stifling and did not allow



people to experience the freedom of God. St. Therese knew from her life that God is merciful love; many scripture passages bore out that truth. She loved the maternal images for God in the OT and the love of God for us in Jesus Christ. She wrote that she could not understand how anyone could be afraid of a God who became a child. She also knew that she would never be perfect. She went to God as a child approaches a parent with open arms and a profound trust.

St. Therese translated "the little way" in terms of a commitment to the tasks and to the people we meet in our everyday lives. She took her assignments in the convent as ways of manifesting her love for God and for others. She worked as a caretaker of the altar and the chapel; she served in the dining hall and in the laundry room; she wrote plays for the entertainment of the community. She tried to show a love for all the nuns in the community. She played no favorites; she gave of herself even to the difficult members. Her life sounds routine and ordinary, but it was steeped in a loving commitment that knew no breakdown. It is called a "little way" precisely by being simple, direct, yet calling for amazing fortitude and commitment.

She sensed that everything that she was able to accomplish came from a generous love of God in her life. She was convinced that at the end of her life she would go to God with empty hands. Why? Because all was accomplished in union with God.

Her "little way" puts holiness within reach of ordinary people. Live out your days with confidence in Gods love for you. Recognize that each day is a gift in which your life can make a difference by the way you choose to live it. Put hope in a future in which God will be all and love will consume your spirit. Choose life, not the darkness of pettiness and greed. St. Therese knew the difference love makes by allowing love to be the statement she made each day of her life.
