Dear Friends,

Back in Old Testament times, the Law was that a good Jew had to give 10% of his income back to the Lord. The idea was that everything in the world is a gift from the Creator God to us, and whatever we have — money, talent, creativity, intelligence, and so on, is from God in the first place. So giving him back the "first fruits" made good sense.

Probably for lots of complicated historical reasons we got away from that. Many other Christian groups still stress tithing and it is a very good spiritual practice. And in the New Testament, Jesus had a somewhat



different emphasis. He stressed sacrificial giving, or "giving of our substance, not of our abundance". A perfect example is the story of the widow's mite – she gave all she had to live on and trusted God to provide.

And that's why tithing and sacrificial giving are so important: it turns our charitable giving from just handing over what's left once we've satisfied all our needs into an act of worship. It becomes a moment where we honor God and put him first, and we tell him we trust him totally. That is so important spiritually.

St. Lawrence parishioners have always been generous and have supported the parish in the past.

I'll be speaking at the St. Lawrence Masses this weekend to introduce our Increased Offertory Campaign, and you'll be getting a letter in the mail about it this coming week. We need to increase our giving to enable the parish to carry on its ministries and provide healthy support to all the great programs we have running. We should put our parish on a solid financial footing.

Please read over the letter and pray about it. Maybe God is asking you to step up to a new level of trust, and put Him first. And maybe not just give what you have left over, but make a sacrificial gift each week.

Next week a member of the parish Finance Council will give an overview of our financial situation and how you can help. There will be a commitment envelope asking you to prayerfully consider increasing your weekly offering, and also to consider electronic giving transfers, which make our income more reliable and predictable, and reduce our administrative costs greatly. On either weekend of October 15th or 22nd we will ask you to make a commitment to increase your weekly offering by leaving that envelope in the collection.





Call the Parish Office and let us know. There is a special blessing for parents expecting a child and we would love to arrange a time for you to receive it at Mass.




Our pilgrimage preparations are taking shape and we have our itinerary almost complete.




Baptized into Christ Jesus our lives are meant to glow with his presence. One way we may grow closer to him is by praying the Rosary. October is the Month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

What consolation the Rosary brings. Remembering the mysteries of Christ's life and Our Lady's life, we repeat Hail Mary after Hail Mary. Indeed, the mysteries of the Holy Rosary- joyful, sorrowful, glorious and luminous- are the mysteries of our own lives as well. As we pray the Rosary, we beg Our Lady to draw us closer to him who is our Light. We remember seeing parents and grandparents so often praying their rosaries, "telling their beads" as some referred to this devotion. We remember as well that for many saints the Rosary was an indispensable part of their daily prayer.

In his biography of Pope Francis, Austen Ivreigh recounts then Cardinal Bergoglio's experience of praying with Saint John Paul:

One afternoon I went to pray the Holy Rosary that the Holy Father was leading. He was in front of us on his knees. With the Holy Father's back to me, I entered into prayer. In the middle of the prayer, I became distracted looking at the pope, and time began to fade away. I began to imagine the young priest, the seminarian, the poet, the worker, the child from Wadowice in exactly the same posture as he was now, praying Hail Mary after Hail Mary. His witness struck me. I felt this man, chosen to guide the Church, was the summation of a path trod together with his Mother in heaven, a path that began in his childhood. And I suddenly realized the weight of the words spoken by the Mother of Guadalupe to Saint Juan Diego, "Do not be afraid. Am I not your mother?" I grasped the presence of Mary in the pope's life. His witness did not get lost in memory. From that time onward I have prayed the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary every day.

Today's Gospel is more like history than a parable.

The king (God) gives a wedding banquet (the happiness of the Messianic age) for his son (Jesus the Messiah). But when he invites people (the Jews) to attend, they refuse to come and make all kinds of excuses. Others attack the king's servants and messengers (the prophets and the early Christian evangelists).

The king becomes angry and "sent his army to destroy those murderers and burn their city". A reference to the Roman army under emperor Titus which sacked and destroyed Jerusalem in AD 70. The Temple, the heart of Judaism, was also destroyed and plundered and has never since been rebuilt. Today an Islamic mosque stands on the site.

Since the invited guests will not come, the servants (the Jewish disciples of Jesus) are instructed to go out and bring in anyone they can find. "They rounded up everyone they met, bad as well as good." All are called – both the good and sinful.

The climax of the story at first seems unfair. People have been pulled in from highways and byways and now one is condemned for not wearing a wedding garment! But the parable has in fact moved to the final judgement. In fact, Matthew may be combining what were two original parables into one.

The wedding garment stands for faith and baptism combined with a lived out commitment to the Gospel, something necessary to be accepted into the eternal happiness of the Kingdom.

As Jesus says at the end, "Many are called, but few are chosen." Many were called and invited to attend the banquet. But more than that was expected of them. They had to answer the call by saying an unqualified Yes to Jesus. Being baptised and having the label 'Christian' or 'Catholic' is not enough. We have also to live out in our lives and relationships what we claim to believe in.





TO BE A CHRISTIAN STEWARD

What identifies a steward? Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are one answer; so is generous giving of time, talent, and treasure. But being a Christian steward means more. As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord.

Disciples as Stewards

Let us begin with being a disciple—a follower of our Lord Jesus Christ. As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples. This has astonishing implications:

- Mature disciples make a conscious decision to follow Jesus, no matter what the cost.
- Christian disciples experience conversion lifeshaping changes of mind and heart—and commit their very selves to the Lord.
- Christian stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be a disciple.
- Stewardship has the power to shape and mold our understanding of our lives and the way in which we live.

Jesus' disciples and Christian stewards recognize God as the origin of life, giver of freedom, and source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and are eager to use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian stewards.


