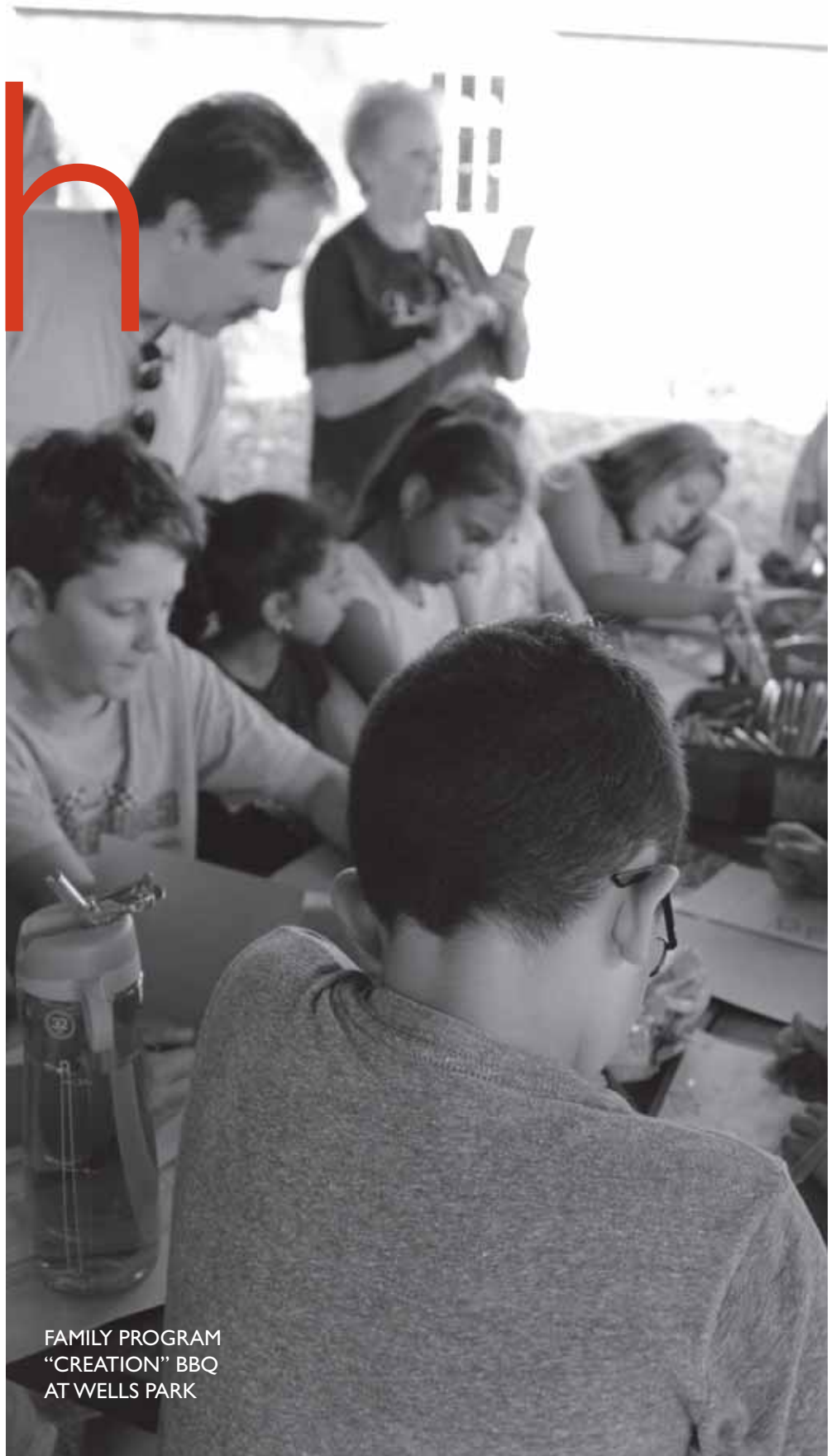

Dear Friends,

We've been talking the past few weeks about "stewardship" of all the blessings God has given us – our time, our talent, and our treasure.

Good stewardship is spiritually important to us as individuals trying to grow closer to him, but it is also the key to building up strong, vibrant, amazing parishes.

Giving of our treasure – our financial sacrifice - is an act of trust in God. It means we know he will guard and protect and bless us even if we do with less. It makes our parishes great because it makes us the kind of Christian we should be.

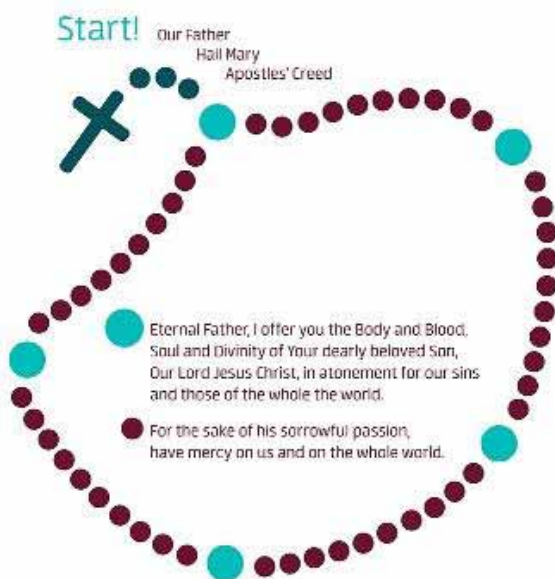

During Holy Hour in the evening, I heard the words, You see My mercy for sinners, which at this moment is revealing itself in all its power. See how little you have written about it; it is only a single drop. Do what is in your power, so that sinners may come to know My goodness (Diary, 1665).

Thank You, Lord Jesus, for Your exceptional love for sinners. May we sinners take full advantage of the mercy You described to St. Faustina. May we come to know Your goodness.

THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

Matthew 22:34-40

Matthew's gospel is building up to its climax. The continued confrontation between Jesus and the religious leaders is leading to the final showdown. This parable is followed in Matthew by three encounters where Jesus' opponents try to wrongfoot him by showing him to be in opposition to the Law. Today we read of a third encounter. The Pharisees, who were very pleased that the Sadducees had been silenced by Jesus, now had their own challenge for him. "Which is the greatest commandment of the Law?" they asked him. This was a much-discussed question among the experts. There were more than 600 laws and it was common to ask which ones were of greater importance than others.

Jesus responds very quickly, not by using his own words but quoting from the Books of the Law themselves. And his answer contains not one but two laws: a. **You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul.** This is from Deuteronomy 6:5, and b. **You must love your neighbour as yourself.** This is from Leviticus 19:18

They both have the word 'love' in common. It is important to be aware that the word translated 'love' here is the verb *agapeo*, from which we get *agape* and not *phileo*. *Agape* can be described as an intense desire for the good or the well-being of the other. *Philia*, on the other hand, implies friendship and affection. We are not asked to have affection for each other, only to work for the good of the other, no matter what that person is like.

And, from the Gospel (e.g. Matthew 25) we know that not only are these two commandments similar, they are complementary and inseparable. In other words, it is not possible to love God and not love the neighbor and vice versa.

So Jesus is, strictly speaking, answering their question about the "greatest commandment" (singular). The greatest commandment is simultaneous to love God and neighbour. And, in Luke's gospel, the identity of the "neighbour" will be clearly shown, although it is also in fact clearly indicated later in Matthew 25 ("I was hungry, thirsty... As often as you did it to the least...you did it to me").

On these two commandments, says Jesus, "hang the whole Law and the Prophets also", in other words, the whole of the Old Testament teaching. The Law was contained in the Pentateuch, the first five books of our Bible; the Prophets included both the major prophets (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel) but also the twelve minor prophets as well as the so-called 'former' prophets – Joshua, Judges, Samuel and Kings. Also included were the Writings, the Wisdom books. And Jesus is saying that as long as one is truly loving God and the neighbour, the rest of the Law will take care of itself. And there may even be times when such love will transcend and override the requirements of some laws. **No truly loving act can ever be sinful.**

Days of the Dead: What's the difference between All Saints' and All Souls'?

Everybody knows the secular holiday of Halloween. But not everybody knows it derives from a holy day, All Saints' Day on Nov. 1, which is followed by All Souls' day on Nov. 2.

The root word of Halloween - "hallow" - means "holy." The suffix "een" is an abbreviation of "evening." It refers to the Eve of All Hallows, the night before the Christian holy day that honors saintly people of the past. "All Saints is a celebration of the communion of saints, those people we believe are in heaven, through good works and God's grace," said the Rev. Richard Donohoe, vicar of Catholic Charities for the Diocese of Birmingham.

All Souls' Day is a day to pray for all souls. Among Catholics, prayers are offered for those in purgatory, waiting to get into heaven.

More than a thousand years ago in Ireland and Britain, a common custom of Christians was to come together on the eve of the feast of All Hallows Day to ask for God's blessing and protection from evil in the world. Often, they would dress in costumes of saints or evil spirits and act out the battle between good and evil around bonfires. That's the source of the modern observance of Halloween.

The Christian concept of the importance of the individual soul underlies All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, which are observed worldwide primarily in the Catholic and Anglican traditions. The "Dia de los Muertos," or "day of the dead," in Latin countries keeps alive some of the tradition of honoring souls of the dead. "All Hallows was considered a time when evil could manifest itself," Donohoe said. "We do believe in the visible and the invisible. There is good and there is evil. There is invisible evil and invisible good. It's an acknowledgement of that existence."

In the Catholic Church, Nov. 1 is a holy day of obligation, when all Catholics are expected to attend Mass. "All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day are related, but they are two separate celebrations," Donohoe said. "On All Saints' Day there's a call to live as saints, to remind us how we're supposed to live. On All Souls' Day, we're talking about all souls and asking God's mercy for them. We're talking about those people who have died before us, and their process of getting to heaven, through Christ."

All Saints' Day emanates from early Christian celebrations of martyrs in the Eastern Church, Donohoe said. "It has its roots all the way back to the fourth century," he said.
