Dear Parishioners,

AREN'T OUR KIDS AWESOME? We're proud that our youth ministry team led by Stephanie Stephens took a big step last week with our Confirmation program.

Nearly 70 kids attended an overnight weekend "Fearless" retreat at Kennedy Catholic High School in Somers, sponsored by Veritas Catholic Camps. More than 300 kids from around the Archdiocese were in attendance and they had a deep experience of faith and prayer, including time before the Blessed Sacrament all throughout the weekend and time for Confession too. Our kids were at home with it all because they are used to time before the Blessed Sacrament with our monthly XLT Holy Hours.

It was a powerful weekend and the kids had a chance to encounter Christ like never before. Thank you to all who made it possible, including parents who went sleepless for a weekend to make it happen.

NOT READY? Advent is sailing by and you're not ready spiritually, right? Well, I have the perfect quick fix for that. Monday, tomorrow, is Confession Monday – we'll have priests available (at least two at a time) from 4:00 to 8:30. This is an essential soul-check we all need if we are going to "prepare the way of the Lord, and make straight his paths". Clear the debris off the road to your heart so Jesus can reach it. The same evening we also have on Monday the amazing "Seasons of Praise" Holy Hour with Fr. Chris Argano speaking in the Church and Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 7:00 to 8:30 pm. Our praise and worship band will lead us in a powerful experience of Christ. Come to this and you will be ready. So drop in for Confession, go get some dinner and come back for 7:00 Holy Hour!

ARE YOU CONFUSED YET? I don't blame you, because Christmas is on a Monday this year. So we have to go to Mass on Christmas of course. But Sunday the 24<sup>th</sup> is the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent. And we have to go to Mass for that like any Sunday. SO: two Masses next weekend for everybody, okay. You can't cheat and do one to count for two different days.

SO: At St. Lawrence, the Masses that count for Sunday are the usual: Saturday night at 5:30 and 7:30 Spanish, Sunday morning at 8:00, 9:30, 11:00, 12:30. The Masses that count for Christmas are Sunday, Christmas Eve starting at 4:00. They are 4:00, 5:30, 7:30 Spanish, 10:00 (Midnight), and Monday, Christmas Day at 8:00, 9:30, 11:00, 12:30.

At Sacred Heart, we will have the usual 4:00 Saturday and 10:30 Sunday. Then 4:00 Sunday Christmas Eve is for Christmas, as well as 8:30 and 10:30 Christmas Day.

GUESS WHAT? The next weekend, New Year's Day also falls on a Monday. But in 2018 New Year's Day is NOT a holy day of obligation. SO: Regular Mass schedules for Sunday, December 31. And on Monday January 1, we have at St. Lawrence a 8:30 and 10:00 a.m. Mass.

IT'S ALMOST CHRISTMAS. But not quite... we all have some spiritual prep work to do.
