



MY FAITH/WHY DO CATHOLICS Why Do Catholics Bury the Dead? by LIFE TEEN

Catholics take care to honor and bury the dead because St. Paul tells us that we are temples of the Holy Spirit, that God lives in our very bodies and therefore we should honor God with them (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). Honoring the body doesn't stop after the person has died.


In Mass we profess our belief in the Resurrection of the body when we say the Creed, 'We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.' Just as Jesus' body was raised and ascended into heaven so we believe our bodies will be returned to us when Jesus returns.

Burying the bodies of the dead reminds us of this hope we have in the Resurrection. It anticipates the reuniting of our body with our soul in heaven. Burial is not simply a disposing of the body but it is caring for that person to the point that it is even a corporal work of mercy to bury the dead (CCC 2300).

Our bodies are not simply shells that can be tossed aside, though our body and soul separate at death the body still belongs to that person and it will be returned to them.

That doesn't mean that we'll have zombie bodies that are disgusting and decaying but we'll have glorified bodies. We'll be able to walk through walls, run as fast and jump as high as we want! The best part is, our glorified bodies won't be able to feel any pain or inconvenience!

If Catholics want to be cremated, that's fine so long as you still have a Catholic burial of the remains and as long you aren't denying belief in the resurrection of the body (CCC 2301).



The Holy Family

Marriage is too often conceived as the sacrament which unites a man and a woman to form a couple. In reality, marriage establishes a family, and its purpose is to increase the number of the elect, through the bodily and spiritual fecundity of the Christian spouses.

1. Every marriage intends children. Although Mary and Joseph were not united in a carnal way, their marriage is a true marriage: an indissoluble, exclusive union, wholly subordinated to the child. Mary and Joseph are united only in order to bring Jesus into the world, to protect and raise him. They have only one child, but he contains the whole of mankind, even as Isaac, an only child, fulfilled the promise made to Abraham of a countless progeny.

2. The purpose of every marriage is to establish a Christian family. The Holy Family observed the religious laws of Israel; it went in pilgrimage to Jerusalem every year with other Jewish families (Lk. 2:41). Jesus saddens and amazes his father and his mother because to their will and company he prefers "to be in his Father's house". Thus it may happen that God's will obliges the family to make disconcerting sacrifices. Yet every Christian family must live in harmony and in prayer, which are the pledges of joy and union.

3. "He remained obedient to them." Jesus was God. And through the fullness of grace Mary stood above Joseph. Nevertheless — if we except the event in the Temple — Joseph remained the head of the family; he took the initiative (as when the Holy Family fled to Egypt), and in Nazareth Jesus obeyed his parents.

GOSPEL REFLECTION



The retired around the parish remind me of Simeon and of Anna, elderly figures. They come into the gospel just for a short time, a bit like Joseph, Zechariah and Elizabeth. Each of them has their bit to say about the coming of the Lord, just like each person we meet says something of God. All are witnesses of the patient search for God in their lives. The elderly can give to the church the security of a life -time's faithfulness and an awareness of God which comes to someone when the time of death seems near.

Unselfishness

There's an unselfishness about Simeon and Anna – all they do is praise God! No big sermon, no big memory trip, no big moral judgment on the rest of us. Prayer often simplifies as we get older. More praise and silence. Or it goes the other way – we get tired of it – same old psalms, same old prayer of St Francis or St Ignatius. Don't be tired of waiting. Waiting keeps us young, keeps us humble, dependent, and able to be surprised.

Pope Francis – 'It's unpleasant to say it, but the aging are put to one side because they are considered a nuisance. However, the Pope continued, old people are those who tell us the history of things, who carry forward the faith and give it to us to inherit. A society that does not take care for and respect the elderly does not have a future because it doesn't have memories. They are the treasure of our society.'
