OUR VISION Create a parish of missionary disciples whose personal relationship with Jesus Christ inspires others into a life-changing relationship with Him.

Dear Friends,

A recent report had some shocking news for us all. Life expectancy in the USA has actually declined slightly in the past few years. The main culprits are two: drug overdoses and suicides.

More than 70,000 Americans died from drug overdoses last year alone. That is nearly double the number who die in car accidents. Suicides took another 45,000 lives, and have increased to the highest rate in decades, far more than the number of homicides. And it has touched home in our own community and our parishes in these past years. We have buried more young people than I like to think about. Their families live with broken hearts.

The causes are many and complex, and we shouldn't oversimplify. But when drug overdoses and suicides are on the rise, it is a sign that despite all the prosperity and comfort, there is a something wrong in our culture – a spiritual sickness. When people don't have a sense that their lives have a meaning and a purpose, we should not be surprised life becomes cheap.

No one seems to know what to do about it. Politicians rush to legalize marijuana and other drugs and dream of new tax revenues. The entertainment world glorifies drug use despite huge numbers of celebrities in rehab and broken lives. We treat depression with drugs and but hardly deal with the deeper causes.

A culture of moral relativism makes us afraid to talk about the commonsense approaches to good mental health – like the critical importance for young people of stable family life, of good training in discipline, sacrifice, of developing virtue and solid moral values, and about the harm done by exposure to mindless violence and an over-sexualized culture. We coddle the young and make excuses rather than challenge them to live for noble ideals rather than just "making it big" or settling for a life of comfort and ease.

We used to know how to do that very well in our society. It is what made the USA what it is. I'm not sure we still know anymore.

Pope St. John Paul II once said to young people:

"It is Jesus who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives, the will to follow an ideal, the refusal to allow yourselves to be ground down by mediocrity, the courage to commit yourselves humbly and patiently to improving yourselves and society, making the world more human and more fraternal."

We need to invite Jesus back into our society and our lives.

After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; then from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them. -Mark 9:2-8

Family is important to me. I never experienced a large family growing up. I loved marrying into a larger family that all got together for certain holidays of the year. And now that I have three children, I would guess we sit down for dinner at the dining table more than most modern families. The world is a very vast space with many challenges, but our little carved out corner of it is always a place of faith, hope, and love.

As a good steward, not only am I called to cherish the gift of my family and work hard so those in it may flourish, I am also called to see them in the context of my larger family of faith. There are times we must come together as a smaller family unit, but we also must participate fully in our larger family, both in our parish and in our global Church. We never stand alone in this world. Even if we have no one left in our immediate bloodline, there is a family that calls to us for engagement. During the seasons of Advent and Lent, our families of faith are gathering more frequently and inviting us inside. The more we participate in our family events, the more grounded we become. The more we share with our family, the more we are sure of our identity. We belong.
