

Vocations, Parishes and Reality in 2019

As you are aware, the vocation crisis has been a crisis way too long and now we are seeing the concrete effects of it in our Archdiocese. For years we have heard about upstate and rural areas being severely short of priests and having to manage three or four parishes with only one priest. Well, that day is coming upon us right here, right now. There is no more postponing it.

Priests retire at age 75 and step down as pastors. This year there are 15 open pastorates, and several more expected within weeks, for various reasons. Fewer and fewer parishes have assistant pastors ready to step up. There are simply not enough priests to go around.

Reasons for the crisis are many: secularization of society, the loss of faith in eternal life, disintegration of families, scandals, etc. But whatever the causes, we have to deal with the reality we face.

We have been impacted here at the parishes of St. Lawrence and Sacred Heart.

Up to 2011, our two parishes combined had five full time priests. By 2016 we were

down to just one full time priest. Since then we've managed by inviting some weekend priests to fill in as they
can amid their other full-time responsibilities. We're grateful to Fr. Tom (Vice Rector of St. Joseph's Seminary), Fr. Joe (Vicar General of the Maryknollers), and Fr. Adolfo (chaplain at Kennedy Catholic High School).

Their help and that of others from time to time has been indispensable. But we can't ask more of them.

We've reduced a few Sunday Masses (two less at each parish), ended daily Mass at Sacred Heart and ended one of the daily Masses at St. Lawrence. We've cut back on Masses for holy days. Deacons often fill in for funerals.

Yet between our two parishes we still offer nine Sunday Masses, which is still more than any other local area parish offers. We manage two campuses with seven buildings, and offer services in two languages, two religious educations programs, two rental properties and an active cemetery. We have streamlined and combined our administration and will continue to make further consolidation for effectiveness and efficiency. Thanks to the effort to build up an excellent lay staff of committed professionals, we are making it work.

I wish I could say we can cover all holy day and Sunday Masses the same as before, but that is not realistic unless our vocation situation changes dramatically. And that is not

likely in the near future.

The brutal facts we have to face are clear: the total number of men who will be ordained over the next five years for our Archdiocese is around 20, given the actual numbers in the seminary. And they are all the new priests coming for 294 parishes and 2.5 million Catholics in our Archdiocese.

More parish mergers and closures are inevitable in the short and middle term. More priests will be managing two or three parishes alone, as we have been doing here for the past three years.

Discouragement and despair are temptations. And they are from the Evil One. Because the Lord is Almighty and he promised "to be with us all days, to the end of time" we will survive. He will be faithful and will be with us in every challenge.



### What can we all do?

- 1. Please pray and make sacrifices for vocations. This is the way to the heart of God. "Pray the harvest master send laborers to his harvest." We must believe that this is the most effective way forward.
- 2. Encourage your children and grandchildren to consider following the call of God to serve his people as a priest or religious sister. Tell them over and over how proud you would be if they would follow God's call. I always knew my parents would be delighted if I responded to a calling, and it was important to me. It will be important to your kids if you support them.
- 3. Be generous and open to the gift of more children. Many vocations come from large families.
- 4. Live your faith as a family. Attend Mass as a family every week, without exception. Live your Catholic faith to the full and insist that your children follow your good example and attend Mass and Confession regularly. Don't give in to them when they get to the age when they want to rebel and drop out.
- 5. If you are the father of the family, your role is critical. All the best studies show that children are much more likely to remain committed to their faith if their dad was a serious, practicing Catholic. The dad's influence is even greater than the mother's influence.
- 6. Be flexible and understanding when changes come, even if they cause inconvenience. We can't continue forever as we have up to now.
- 7. Get active in the Church as lay people and become real intentional disciples men and women of deep Catholic conviction who can invite friends and neighbors and relatives back to the practice of the faith.
- 8. Be more generous than ever to the Church many of the changes and adaptations we have to make are expensive more than in the days of many priests and nuns.

And finally, live with supernatural hope – not in how things seem to be going, because at times they do seem to be going badly. But hope in the infinite power of a good God who loves his people and wants all to be saved and to come to knowledge of him.

# why i chose to become catholic

I didn't know at first that I wanted to become a Catholic, I just knew that I wanted to bring my family closer to God, and to each other. I didn't grow up in a religious family. My husband Michael was baptized Catholic, but didn't attend church, so faith wasn't a topic that we discussed. Over the past few years it started to bother me that we didn't go to church or teach our three children about Jesus, especially during the holidays. I realize now that this was the Holy Spirit guiding me.

Last Easter, I was talking to my mom about this on the phone and she suggested that we bring the kids to Catholic church, since my husband's family is Catholic and his mom goes to Mass at St. Lawrence every Sunday. I was a little taken aback by this, since I had only ever been to one mass and knew nothing about Catholicism. I had never heard of *RCIA* and it hadn't crossed my mind that you can join the Church as an adult.

The more I thought about my mom's advice, the more I knew in my heart that this was the right thing to do. I told Michael and we agreed to take the kids to Mass with his mom that weekend. I contacted the rectory and told them about my family, and that we wanted to start attending church. They were so kind and welcoming, and had arranged for us to meet Father Gill. He helped us so much by explaining the sacraments, how we would plan for our family to receive them, and answering our questions about becoming parishioners.

Going to Mass awed and overwhelmed me at first. I often left with more questions than I had before it started. How did everyone know these prayers by heart, and know exactly when to say them? How did they all know the right time to stand, to sit, or kneel? My friend Irene invited me to go to daily Mass with her, and stillness and peace I found at church that day was indescribable. I started going to Mass whenever I could, and slowly

it all started making more sense. When a half hour Mass in the morning wasn't enough, I started going to the adoration chapel. Praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament is what made me absolutely certain that I wanted to become Catholic. It was first time in my life I felt truly close to Christ, which is what I had been searching for all this time. The more we went to church, the more I listened, and prayed, and read.. the more I knew that every word being spoken at Mass was true. Jesus is really there, and I've felt it since that first time I walked through the doors with my family.

Michael and I started *RCIA* last October, beginning with the *Alpha* program. It was a great way to meet new friends in the Parish, talk about our faith, and gain some new perspective. In January we started our meetings with Deacon Mark. We were both excited to learn all that we could about the sacraments we would soon be receiving along with the other Candidates in our group. We left every meeting feeling inspired and more prepared for the upcoming Easter Vigil.

I don't know if I'll ever be eloquent enough to describe in words what I felt on the night of Easter Vigil, but I'll try my best. As a mother, finally watching my three children be baptized, right along with me, I felt such immense joy and wonder at how God had led us to that moment. It's a precious memory I'll cherish forever. When Michael and I were being confirmed, I knew that were doing the best thing we have ever done for our kids, and for our marriage. We had worked toward this together as a family, just as the Holy Spirit led us to do. When it was time for my first communion, and Father Gill motioned for me to come up, it had to have been the most powerful moment I have ever experienced. I was left with no doubt in my mind that I am Catholic. I had finally found the missing piece of who I am.

I would like to thank my dear friend and Sponsor, Irene. You inspire me more than you know. I'd like to also thank all the wonderful friends we've made this past year. St. Lawrence O'Toole is a truly special community. Thank you for making us a part of your family.
