Dear Friends,

June is the month of many great feasts in the Church: Pentecost, the Most Blessed Trinity, Corpus Christi and the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Last Sunday we celebrated the beautiful Feast of Corpus Christi with 200 parishioners processing through the streets of Brewster, from the train station to the Church - with the Blessed Sacrament held high. That brought home to us all what is at the center of our Faith – the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. After we walked through the streets giving witness of what we believe and cherish as Catholics, we received Benediction in the Church. Renewing our love for Christ in the Eucharist renews our spiritual life and is essential for us to persevere today.

We need that renewal and that grounding, and spending time before the Blessed Sacrament each week is something I recommend every one of us do. In the end, it is Jesus Christ who will keep us faithful and close to his heart.

Many parishioners are concerned, as we all should be, that our politicians in New York City and State are increasingly promoting agendas in conflict with our Catholic values. The whole nation was shocked earlier this year as the Governor celebrated the signing of an abortion bill making it legal to abort a baby right up to the time of birth.

And now there are efforts to decriminalize the drugs and marijuana devastating our people as if it were a good thing. Each time I officiate at a funeral (two more the past two months!) for a drug-related death, I wonder how people can be so short-sighted to legalize such dangerous substances.

And now there are moves to legalize prostitution. Who thinks that is healthy for society?

All these moves reflect a society that no longer embraces a set of convictions we all hold in common. We no longer have a consensus on what is good and healthy. Without that, we allow everyone to do whatever he or she wants.

At the same time, we see the increased tendency to punish and ostracize anyone with a different way of thinking or with traditional values on marriage, sexuality, or family life. We're in a time like the early Christians found themselves in when the culture around us is at odds with what we believe and increasingly hostile to our values.

Like those early Christians, we need to return to the Eucharist as the center of our life, because Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. He promised he would remain with us all days.

from barely brushing her teeth to celebrating her husband's life

A little over a year ago, I suddenly lost my husband, the love of my life for over 40 years. In the weeks and months that followed, life seemed so overwhelming without Ed by my side. As Thanksgiving and Christmas approached, I prayed to God to give me strength to get through the holidays for the sake of my children and grandchildren. God answered my prayers last fall when a parishioner of St Lawrence O'Toole told me about a seminar they were running entitled: **Surviving the Holidays**. I wanted to attend, but I am not from the area and I was terrified to attend by myself. I asked my son to go with me. We both walked away from this seminar with realistic strategies. Even though we all missed Ed tremendously, we were able to smile, laugh, and find joy in the holidays.

In January, the weekly *From Mourning to Joy, GriefShare Bereavement Program* began and I knew God was speaking to me again. I found myself in a room with people who cared about me and understood what I was going through. No one can tell us how to grieve or how long to grieve, but the practical **GriefShare** videos and compassionate group discussion have allowed me to progress from a woman who could barely brush her teeth in the morning to one who celebrates her husband's life and the time we had together.


Whether your loved one has been gone for one month or many years, grief is an emotion that needs to be worked through, not avoided, if we are to move forward with joy and purpose.
