# while we're at it

**OUR VISION** Create a parish of missionary disciples whose personal relationship with Jesus Christ inspires others into a life-changing relationship with Him.

Dear Friends.

We're all sickened by the seemingly non-stop mass shootings that take so many lives and by our inability to understand what goes on in the minds of the shooters. How can people have such complete disregard for innocent human life and unleash such violence and cruelty? What has become of our society that these atrocities start to become commonplace and we can't even remember them all?

The TV pundits and politicians either blame gun ownership, divisive speech, racism and political disunity and discord. Maybe some of that is true.

But maybe those are symptoms of deeper problems – where it is obvious that we are a society that has lost our traditional convictions about civility as well as the sanctity of human life. We used to take seriously the idea that we are all "made in the image and likeness of God" and that gave every person a dignity that called for respect. But things have changed dramatically:

- Our manner in dealing with others has coarsened and we have lost much of our traditional respect and tolerance. Differences are settled by threats of violence, abusive language, and generally bad manners. What happened to the manners and politeness our parents taught us?
- Our communities used to be places where we policed ourselves where we had shared values that we reinforced with neighbors, relatives and friends and where aberrant behavior was stigmatized and discouraged. Today we all keep quiet out of fear of being perceived as "politically incorrect". Why don't communities seem to work anymore?
- We have become a terribly litigious society where people sue each other for nearly any perceived offense as long as they think they can extract money from others. Where has forgiveness and reconciliation gone?
- Since the early 1970's we have allowed the abortion of nearly 50 million unborn children because they were "unplanned" or "unwanted". What happened to welcoming every new life as a gift from God?
- Support for the death penalty is too often motivated not by notions of justice or the defense of society but by a thirst for vengeance. Is that really noble and humane?
- States are one by one passing "assisted suicide" laws so doctors can enable the terminally ill and elderly people to take their lives because they lack "quality of life". Life that is a burden to us often gets discarded rather than supported and compassionately accompanied by others who care. What does that mean for people with disabilities?
- We have grown used to movies, television and video games that glorify grisly violence, destruction and murder. The entertainment industry has grown rich feeding our appetite for ever more extreme violence in the name of "free speech".

St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta used to say "Abortion is the greatest destroyer of peace". In addition to being a saint in serving the poor in love, she was also a prophetess.

In a society where life is cheap, we should not be surprised what people are capable of doing to each other.



We reap what we sow.

May Jesus change our hearts with the power of his Gospel of Love and lead every one of us to follow him.

# 5 things catholics should know about first fridays

Learn about devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the graces that come from observing First Fridays

It is no wonder, therefore, that our predecessors have constantly defended this most approved form of devotion — the pious devotion of the faithful toward the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus [and] the custom of receiving Holy Communion on the first Friday of every month at the desire of Christ Jesus, a custom which now prevails everywhere. —Pope Pius XI Miserentissimus Redemptor

### What's so special about First Fridays?

Our parents grew up going to church every First Friday of the month and taking part in Sacred Heart devotions, but in recent decades the pious practice has fallen out of practice, and is dismissed by some as an "old-fashioned" anachronism.

A main reason for the decline in interest in this devotion is probably rooted in simple ignorance: people don't know what First Fridays are all about; families and parishes may not have adequately passed down their importance to the next generation. Here are five things to know.

### 1. How did the First Friday Devotion begin?

While some saints referenced the Heart of Jesus in their writings even centuries earlier, in 1673, a French Visitandine (Visitation) nun named Margaret Mary Alacoque had visions of Jesus, wherein he asked the Church to honor His Most Sacred Heart. In particular, Jesus asked the faithful to "receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months." The request was connected to a specific promise made to all who venerated and promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart. After Margaret Mary's death, the First Friday practice steadily spread in the Church — endorsed by popes and promoted by saints — but it greatly increased in popularity when Margaret Mary was canonized a saint in 1920 by Pope Benedict XV.

### 2. Why nine consecutive months?

The number nine is traditionally associated with a novena and finds its origin in the nine days that the apostles spent in prayer before Pentecost. A novena provides an extended amount of time for preparation and interior renewal.

### 3. What am I supposed to do on First Fridays?

Go to Mass and receive Holy Communion with the intention of honoring Christ's Sacred Heart. If you are not in a state of grace, and thus unable to receive, you will also need to go to confession.

**4. What are the "promises" connected to this devotion?** Jesus said to St. Margaret Mary, "In the excess of the mercy of my heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour." This means that if a person faithfully receives communion for nine consecutive months on First Fridays, Jesus will grant that person extra graces at the time of their death, making it possible to repent of their sins and receive the last rites (if needed).

### 5. Are the First Fridays a "ticket" to heaven?


It is not as simple as going to Mass for nine months and then clocking out, never going to Mass again and leading a sinful life! The entire purpose of this devotion is to draw a person closer to the heart of Christ. If a person fulfills these obligations with sincere faith, it is natural for he or she to be closer to God and better prepared for death. The moment that this devotion is observed in a superstitious manner, neglecting the need to live a virtuous life, all bets are off and Jesus' promise is null and void.

Jesus wants us to rest on his heart, like St. John, and the First Friday devotion is an opportunity for us to encounter him more than just on Sundays and to deepen our love of him.

Coming to know, love and trust that we may take rest in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and place our anxieties within, is what the First Fridays are all about.

# my name is kenny, i can't talk

Every chair in the dining hall was filled on the evening of July 8 th and I felt a great appreciation for all the people from the Brewster Community and St. Lawrence O'Toole parish that came filled with anticipation to celebrate the launch of my book, *My Name is Kenny I Can't Talk*.

The culmination of 3½ years of work was both emotional and satisfying as the first night of my two-part book club began. Since no one

had read the book, the night was designed to introduce the readers to the important messages within. Twelve tables of men, women, and teens delved deeply into their own hearts during the lively discussion periods that followed presentations from me and three contributors to the book.

My husband Kenny had battled debilitating oral cancer for over 21-years, but I had seen good come out of it. Kenny had made a big impact on the people in his life and had made the world a little bit better. These participants strived to see how they could follow his witness and impact the people in their own lives as he did.

On August 5<sup>th</sup> the readers returned ready to discuss the perspectives that most dearly touched their hearts. At one part of the evening, people took turns coming forward and sharing very raw, intimate thoughts on the words they had read.

The key topic of the evening was the value of suffering and how we can unite our suffering with Christ for the good of souls. It is a tough teaching to understand and embrace. With Kenny's witness and the sharing of the readers, the evening brought many people closer to the path of understanding.

I'm so glad I read this book and attended the discussion last night. I'm sorry I didn't know Kenny personally, but I now have a better understanding about suffering and the good and stronger love that can come because of it.


# not alone in the journey




