OUR VISION Create a parish of missionary disciples whose personal relationship with Jesus Christ inspires others into a life-changing relationship with Him.

Dear Friends,

Last weekend the Gospel invited us to reflect on how we pray – whether we are like the Pharisee who thinks he is just fine and is trying to convince God he owes him something for being so good, or like the tax collector who understands and admits his failings and just asks for forgiveness and mercy. A real contrast between pride and humility in our prayer.

This week the Gospel presents the conversion of a bad guy named Zaccheus – the chief tax collector in Jericho – who encountered Jesus and allowed that experience to change his life. The message is clear – no matter how much we may have messed up, Jesus will forgive and will give us a new life, if we are willing to let him.

People sometimes wonder how they can deepen their own conversion and make it real and concrete.

Here are a few ideas for you:

- 1. November is the month of the holy souls in Purgatory. It may be that most people, including our loved ones, spend time in Purgatory to be purified of their sins before they are ready to enter heaven. The Church has always believed our prayers for them help them and speed their arrival to heaven. We all have a duty to pray for the faithful departed... work in a decade of the rosary every day for them. A great tradition is to visit a cemetery and pray for the souls buried there. It's also a good reminder to us that one day we will be among the "faithful departed" and will depend on the prayers of the living.
- 2. Committed Christian service to others is a great expression of our charity and compassion for those in need. Give some thought to how you should give of yourself to others less fortunate. You could help with our homeless shelter. You could be a Stephens Minister accompanying someone in a crisis



moment. You could work at the local food pantry... give some of your time to others and you will feel yourself living charity in action.

- 3. Get to Confession there's nothing like sacramental absolution to remove our sins and make us good with God again. Doesn't matter if it's been a long time, or if it is about a sin you can't quite shake off God's grace and power comes through the sacrament, and the Devil is sent packing when Jesus is called upon to heal us.
- 4. Drop into Church whenever you're in the neighborhood even a 5-minute visit has a way of making an impact on you... and rebooting your day so it can focus on God and his goodness to you.

On October 26 the **Stephen Ministry of St Lawrence O'Toole** hosted a workshop to introduce this wonderful Christian care giving ministry to 10 other churches in the New York Connecticut area. It was attended by over 50 participants including many from our own parish. Our Stephen Ministers provided a lovely breakfast and refreshments throughout the workshop as well as managing the Resource table and registration table, serving through Christ.

Stephen Ministers provide high quality one to one Christian care to those experiencing crisis in their lives. This very confidential and personal time spent builds a strong bond between the care giver and care receiver through Christ. They meet regularly with their care receiver to listen, pray and support through these difficult times. It could be grief, illness or loneliness, in each we find Christ's love

Rev. Galen Dalrymple, came to us from Chicago to present the workshop. He is a facilitator for Stephen Ministry headquartered in St Louis. Rev. Dalrymple has held various positions within the ministry and travels around the country speaking on behalf of Stephen Ministry.

The workshop consisted of three topics

- · Ministering to those experiencing grief
- An introduction to Stephen Ministry
- · How to care in a distinctively Christian way

These topics are a small sampling of the extensive 50 hours of training our ministers have gone through to be able to bring Christ to those in need, growing in our own faith while training and caring. One of the activities the participants experienced was a Prayer and Share exercise. This enabled them to experience in a short time what it would be like to be a Stephen Minister care giver.

Many of the participants were excited to return to their churches and share what they had learned with their pastors and begin the training process to establish a ministry within their church. 
