



Sadly, we cannot do funerals at the moment, but we can bury them in sacred ground, have a service at the cemetery, and a memorial Mass later on when things get back to normal.

Please let me know of anyone who is sick so we can pray. If anyone is seriously ill, call me urgently at my cellphone 301-873-8418 and I will go administer Anointing of the Sick at home or in the hospital. It is so important to get them the graces of the sacraments before they pass away.

Our parishes' outreach to the vulnerable through the *Safety Squad* is ongoing... we have 60 people calling all the elderly and shut ins to make sure they are okay and their needs are met.

you don't have to be alone in grief

"He has risen, Alleluia"! My Mom posted this message on her Facebook page before she died three years ago. It was the last message she wrote. She shared this beautiful thought on Easter, six months later, she died, the result of an accident that no one expected. Mom was the heart of our family, always there to listen, offer unconditional love, wisdom, and encouragement. We miss her very much. Although this was a painful experience for me, I can honestly say that despite the pain, something good came from it. Through prayer and the support of many, God healed me of my pain and grief.


They say nothing prepares us for the death of a loved one. Yet it is something that each of us will encounter sooner or later. For many, the journey of grief is a lonely one, but it doesn't have to be that way. At St Lawrence, we have a community for those looking for healing and support on their grief journey.

The St Lawrence Bereavement Program Griefshare: *From Mourning to Joy* offers weekly meetings, which

include prayer, a video presentation, and group discussion. We use a nationally recognized program called Griefshare. Topics for discussion include the challenges faced during the grieving process, such as how to manage relationships, how not to get stuck in grief, and how to turn to God for help. Meetings are Tuesday evenings from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Recently we have started meeting via video conference with **Zoom**. Connecting this way has been a great blessing for the group. Participants are able to see one another and share how they are doing. This simple act of being apart physically but together to share our stories has been a powerful way to help us all get through this difficult time.

Since the program began, many have benefited. Participants have shared their experience of how God is working in their lives, helping them to overcome challenges. It's beautiful to see the healing that is happening through this ministry. If you, or someone you know, is grieving the loss of a loved one, I encourage you to come and experience the St Lawrence Griefshare Program: *From Mourning to Joy*. My mom didn't smell the roses but she knew it was St. Therese letting her know everything would be okay. I wish I did smell the roses! Your video is a reminder to me my mom's great devotion to St. Therese, the little flower of Jesus. My mom's anniversary is next week on Holy Thursday, April 9th . Please say a prayer for her soul".



spiritual medicine




