

Happy Mother's Day!

A few days ago, I buried the mother of a parishioner. We can't do funeral Masses or big wakes, so we did all the prayers in the cemetery by the casket with a small group of family only. The daughter wept quietly. It brought back memories of my own mom's passing several years ago. I remember my mom, now with growing gratitude and love. All the moments when I was sick with chicken pox or mumps as a kid, she took care of me. I remember her as the first to encourage my vocation back when I was an altar boy. I remember her sticking up from me when my friend's mom blamed me for something instead of her own kid. I remem-



ber how proud she was when I went off to the seminary, even though it was so hard for her because I would be overseas studying in Rome for years, and then assigned in another state as a priest. I remember how she joined an organization called "Mothers of Priests" and was delighted to be part of what she considered an "elite group" of moms with sons God had called. I remember how as she was declining in health and I couldn't get home much because of parish responsibilities, she waited. And one day when I got home for a visit for a few days... we had a great chat and reminisced and caught up on things. And that night in her sleep she passed away peacefully. I think she was just waiting for me to get home one last time.

To all mothers, grandmothers, stepmothers – maybe day by day you don't realize the impact you have on us. You make so many sacrifices without even thinking. You have no idea how much good you do and how much love you sow in our hearts and how you leave an indelible impression.

And a word of thanks also to everyone who gave so generously to our Giving Help and Hope Campaign donating gift cards, essential items, non-perishables... we were able to give assistance to 214 families in need and out of work. It really showed our parishes are wonderful, giving places. One thing we know from the Scripture for sure: when we stand before the Lord on Judgement Day, he will definitely ask us what we did "for the least of our brothers". We want to be able to say we did everything we could. Thank you for loving Jesus in our brothers and sisters.



# good bye, you will be missed!



I moved to Brewster in October 2000. Less than a year later, 911 happened. I was between jobs and as I walked out to my car to drive to daily Mass, I couldn't help but notice what a beautiful day it was. While in church, when we came to the prayer of the faithful, I wanted to pray for the first responders from the pew, but being somewhat new, I did not feel comfortable saying it out loud. I felt a foreboding need for these brave men and women who were rushing to the scene.

Like so many other people throughout New York, the nation and the world, I felt helpless, but wanted to do something. I began to search. I decided to join the Knights of Columbus, a

group of Catholic men who exercise their religion by focusing on charity. I found this to be a good way for me to enter more actively into my faith as a Catholic man.

After several years, in 2008, I became the Grand Knight. I focused on getting more young men to join. With the help of two good friends, who worked hard and diligently, and with the help of our pastor, Fr. McKeon, our numbers grew and the average age of the membership of our council dropped significantly. I was also lucky enough to be Grand Knight for our 100th anniversary! When I completed my tenure as Grand Knight, I was encouraged to move up the ranks within the Knights of Columbus organization, but I was feeling as if I were being called in a different direction by God. I consulted with Fr. McKeon who suggested I look into the diaconate. I did, and the rest, as they say, is history.

In 2017 a few months before ordination I was the lay director for our last Men's Cornerstone retreat. I have led Bible Study Courses including 'The Bible Time Line', 'Acts of the Apostles', and 'The Wisdom Books'. Recently, I led 'Return' and 'No Greater Love'. For the past year or so I have been the spiritual director for Men's Ministry.

The parish showed me tremendous support for which I am truly grateful. With my early retirement, I found myself having to reevaluate everything. My daughter had been hoping for years that I would be near her and the grandchildren. I pray that I am following in God's footsteps and that I am going where he wants me to be. I ask you all to pray for me and know that you will always be in my prayers.

This weekend I say good bye to all of you. Always remember parishioners of St. Lawrence O'Toole and Sacred Heart, you have become an important part of my life. I wouldn't be surprised if we find ourselves working together in the future to help bring about God's Kingdom on earth.


