You may have seen in the news that some churches around the country are reopening this month, at least slowly and partially. Since New York is the hardest hit area and we aren't far from the city, it will take a little longer before we get the green light from the governor and the Archdiocese.



When we do, we'll be following safety protocols like those in other places. Those might include limiting the number of people at each Mass to a half or a quarter of capacity, wearing masks, social distancing, and so on. Things we have gotten used to but are a little strange in Church where we gather as God's people to worship him together. We don't know exactly what it will involve yet. I'm hoping we get some clarity in the next few weeks. But be assured we will put safety first.

In the meantime, hundreds of people are tuning in to our livestreamed Masses Sunday mornings, or touching base with our daily Facebook LIVE **Daily Bread** Gospel reflections at noon, the **Divine Mercy** Chaplet at 3:00 pm, and the **Psalm You to Sleep** at 9:00 pm. We are still a parish family despite the temporary complications. Thank you for your faithfulness.

Sr. Susan Greene, RDC, (formerly known as Sr. Mary Theophane), a Sister of the Divine Compassion, died peacefully on April 17, 2020.

Sr. Susan taught at St Lawrence O'Toole from 1962 to 1971. She received her BS in Chemistry from Good

Counsel College in White Plains, she was an accomplished artist. Her St. Lawrence bulletin boards were known to have won awards. Sr. Susan spent many years in elementary education. She also taught at St. Anthony's, West Harrison, Sacred Heart School, Hartsdale, and St. Joseph's, Croton Falls. In 1976, she taught Art at Preston HS, followed by Kennedy Catholic and Good Counsel Academy Elementary School.

Former students, remember her as being a wonderful teacher who was kind and funny. She was known for telling students she had feathers instead of hair and would wear a feather peeking out of her habit. Sr. Laura Donovan, President of the Sisters of the Divine Compassion said, "Sr. Susan was a nun without borders. So strong was her charity and dedication to God's work that she was in mission until her last breath."



## send your guardian angel to mass with this prayer

When you can't make it to Mass and are stuck at home, send your guardian angel to church to intercede for you!

Our daily life, whether we realize it or not, is surrounded by the protecting presence of angels!

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church affirms, "From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession. 'Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life.' Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God" (CCC 336)

Angels are here to help us and above all, guide us to eternal life.

Many saints would send their guardian angels on various errands, such as praying at a church for them when they were physically unable to do so. This works because angels are spiritual beings and are able to move about our world with relative ease, going from one place to another in less than a second.

This means that when we ask our guardian angel to attend Mass for us, being stuck at home, they will go instantly!

To attend Mass for them is a great joy, as "Christ is the center of the angelic world. They are his angels" (CCC 331). They love God and will gladly pray for us at Mass anywhere in the world!

The angelic world is mysterious, but we are encouraged to pray to them in faith and trust that they will do what they can to lead us closer to God. Here is a beautiful prayer, often printed on prayer cards, that dates to the 1920s and sends your guardian angel to Mass when you are unable to attend the Holy Sacrifice.

O HOLY ANGEL at my side, Go to Church for me, Kneel in my place, at Holy Mass, Where I desire to be.

At Offertory, in my stead, Take all I am and own, And place it as a sacrifice Upon the Altar Throne.

At Holy Consecration's bell, Adore with Seraph's love, My Jesus hidden in the Host, Come down from Heaven above.

Then pray for those I dearly love, And those who cause me grief, That Jesus' Blood may cleanse all hearts, And suff'ring souls relieve.

And when the priest Communion takes, Oh, bring my Lord to me, That His sweet Heart may rest on mine, And I His temple be.

Pray that this Sacrifice Divine, May mankind's sins efface; Then bring me Jesus' blessing home, The pledge of every grace. Amen

# new session starts may 28th

"The class **Prayer with Peter** has been a beautiful spiritual journey for me so far. Each week we use Lectio Divina to pray

with the Sunday Gospel reading. Discussion revolves around how God responds to each person differently, as His message is different for each person.

Based on the interest of the class, we have learned about the Nine Choirs of Angels, the Surrender Novena and Saint Michael Chaplet. Last week we talked about the love of the Father and Peter played and sang an original song, telling us how the Father wants to heal us and bring us home.

One of the most inspiring aspects of the class is seeing so many young adults attend and share in the discussions. Please join us for the next four weeks!" -- *Janice Nastasi* 

"A couple weeks ago, I saw in bulletin that St. Lawrence was offering a study with our director of music, Peter Ryan. Peter is new, and I only hear his music, so I figure I could get to know him better. Helping Peter is Jack Kristensen, a new parishioner and a seminarian. Coming in, I had no idea how this was going to be run or what is was about. For someone like me who does not have one bit of musical talent (God did not pass out any musical notes my way) but loves Christian or Gospel song, I was inspired to take this course.

We start by reading the Gospel for the following Sunday. Jack reads it and Peter plays the guitar, while we are mediating on scripture. Shortly after, we all come together to share what jumps out at us from scripture reading, and there is no pressure to share your thoughts. When sharing, we follow a form that Peter has shared: A.R.R (Acknowledge, Relate, And Receive). They also introduced us to the St. Michael Chaplet, which is a specific Rosary (Rosary of the Angels). Hearing the younger generation's thoughts is incredible. They seem so much more open and expressive. Peter and Jack are so informed and in tune to what Jesus was telling his disciples and us.

It took me 70 years to get to the point in my faith. For anyone who wants to learn more about Jesus and our faith, I recommend this class. You will feel refreshed after."

# pietra fitness!

I am a wife, homeschooling mother of five children, and parishioner of St. Lawrence O'Toole. In 2012, I suffered a health trauma that affected almost every system of my body. A year into my recovery, doctors recommended yoga for its physical and mental health benefits. After attending yoga classes at a gym for six months, I saw significant physical improvements but I had a feeling of conflict and darkness that covered me. I knew that Christ was asking me to seek healing through a means that did not conflict with my Catholic faith.

Yoga describes an integrated whole of philosophies, spirituality, and physical practices based in Hinduism and found in Buddhism and New Age practices. An exercise program cannot be both because Christianity (coming from Christ) and yoga (based in Hinduism/Buddhism/New Age) have fundamental differences in theology and philosophy. Christian activities are firmly centered on Christ.



So, when I came across Pietra Fitness, which is founded by Catholics, guided by priests, and approved by bishopsit was an answer to prayer! Pietra Fitness is stretching and strengthening exercises, based on Danish exercise poses which pre-existed postural yoga, and it includes Christian meditation in the Catholic tradition, helping participants to seek God's will and conform their lives

to His will, so they can find true peace and joy. Pietra Fitness is a retreat for the body, mind, heart and soul that invites you to quiet your mind and heart, to start up a conversation with God, and "Ora Et Labora" pray while working.

When you hear the good news, you can't help but share it with those you love! I hope you can join me starting Saturdays, May 23 to June 13th from 8:30 am to 9:30 am, as I share an introduction to Pietra Fitness with you.

The program sessions will be run on Zoom, so you will need a computer or phone with a working camera and a mic or headphones to participate. Zoom link will be emailed to participant after registration.




