





## redemptive suffering

One of my first assignments as Eucharistic Minister to the home-bound was to an elderly man three years bed-ridden with cancer. He had little strength but boy his eyes lit up when receiving the Eucharist and Word of God! Next to his bed hung a three foot cross of Christ Crucified. I noticed the wood floor from his bed to the foot of the cross was worn to the sub-floor.

When I asked his full-time nurse what that was from she told me, "every night he prays for two hours and then lowers his medical bed, shimmies onto the floor over to the cross to kiss the feet of Jesus". When I asked him "Why?" he pulled me close and whispered in my ear, "to console The Sacred Heart of Jesus". This memory is forever etched in my heart and for the next year and a half, he would teach me what this meant.

You may be wondering what this has to do with redemptive suffering? The answer is everything. Ephesians 5:16 says, "This may be a wicked world but your lives should redeem it". The word redeem means to rescue, set free, or ransom back to God what has been lost. We often lose sight of the definition to "set free," and we miss the power of our example as Christians to do exactly that — set our neighbor free. Having been born on the Feast Day of St. Peter and

St. Paul I can attest to this claim. Two saints who after many trials spent a good deal of there ministry to the early Christian Community to embrace suffering as an authentic witness to the fortitude and fidelity of their baptism in Christ Jesus. United with Christ, every trial can be transformed and elevated into Redemptive Suffering. It is Jesus who continues to suffer in the Christian for the good of all mankind.

Don't get me wrong, suffering is hard. I know first hand from the many tragedies in my own life and the health battle I am now facing. And I am keenly aware of the suffering ignited by this pandemic to the likes we have never imagined. The secular world will volley every ill-conceived remedy at you to avoid that suffering. As one of my "Bible-buddies" taught me, "play volleyball with Christ instead". Serve it back to Him and you will find, He likes to play both sides of the net. Don't wait for the storm to pass by to look for Christ. Look for Him in the midst of the storm instead. Every pain we endure with love, every cross borne with resignation, benefits every man, woman, and child in the Mystical Body of Christ. And yes, by consoling the Sacred Heart of Jesus, our desires begin to be attracted to the things that He is attracted to; our longings begin to long for the things that He longs for, and the hope we bare in the One who is in control will usher in the eternal life paid in full by His precious blood.

And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

# deepening faith in prayer

We have a church community that understands our spiritual needs. I had the honor of participating in some groups with our wonderful church volunteers and our beloved pastor Father Gill. They dedicated their time to prepare for

us these groups so that we could unite in worship, prayer, and study. One group was facilitated by Peter Ryan, our devoted Musical Director, and Jack Kristensen, a parishioner who is a Seminarian. PRAYER WITH PETER has been a blessing and an inspiration as well as a source of light in a time of darkness and confusion. In Prayer with Peter, I learned to calm my thoughts, allow God to enter my mind and heart through the Word as I reflected during Lectio Divina. I learned to wait on the Lord by keeping quiet and

listening to the music and words as they spoke and hearing what Jesus wants to tell me.

We learned about a meditation called the pirate prayer (ARRR). This prayer is a means to develop a relationship with Jesus. Each letter of "ARRR" represents an action (Acknowledge, Relate, Receive, Respond) and together lead into a connection with Jesus on an individual level. He meets us where we are at.

I learned how scripture is more than a source of knowledge but rather a powerful source of connection and understanding. I often focus on Jesus being crowned and I focus on his pain. He was obedient to fullfill his mission. The fact that I can offer up my pain to be transformed to help someone is amazing.

It was a wonderful experience of how each of us shared our understanding of what we read and understood from the Word in the Gospel. Everyone shared something that God revealed to them. This made me feel that God loves us each individually. He loves us as we are.

Peter and Jack have a wealth of knowledge to share about our faith and encouraged us to ask questions we might have. They were so helpful clearing up some of our concerns. This openness allowed us to let go of fear. I appreciated this so much. I loved the music that Peter played because it flowed with his words every time and led us into prayer mode. From the beginning, I felt this group was heaven sent. If singing in church is praying twice, Peter's music must sound like an Angelic orchestra in heaven!

I look forward to the next Prayer with Peter in the fall. Thank you so much. God keeps blessing all of us.

# update on st. lawrence centennial renovation campaign

Last month, we made another \$150,000 payment off the principal balance of our loan. This brings our remaining balance down from \$750,000 to \$600,000. We hope to pay this off completely over the next five years, and that will mark ten years (2015) since we did the great renovation of the Church for our 100th anniversary of the stone church. At present our interest payments amount to \$30,000 per year so we want to pay it off as soon as possible.

The overall cost of the renovation was \$3.8 million. We've come a long way, paying approximately \$3.2 million plus about \$400,000 interest in five years. We borrowed from the Archdiocese at 5% annual interest and we have been paying it down steadily with your





generous help. We also used \$900,000 from the sale of the land we had acquired back in 2003 for a possible new church.

Many people made pledges for five years, others gave

gifts as they were able, others made longer term pledges and still others are continuing to help with the Centennial Gold envelopes or through *WeShare*. Every dollar we receive from Centennial Gold goes straight to eliminating our debt. None of it is taxed or assessed in any way by the Archdiocese.

You have been tremendous in your support for this renovation and your ongoing support of this campaign. If you haven't yet and if you possibly can, use the Centennial Gold envelopes each month or give to Centennial on *WeShare*. Whatever you can give each month, be it \$10 or \$50 or \$100, helps make us debt free. This chart shows what came in during June, for example.

ple like myself seeking each other. It was alive again with human hearts anticipating with gratitude participating in the Mass.

As I sat in the pew, people who offered a wave or nod of peace again surrounded me. As they nodded their greetings my spirit relaxed as I felt enveloped by Our Lady and Christ who welcomed me home. Then add to that anticipation the excited feeling that I would be receiving The Eucharist was indescribable. After receiving back in the pew, I heard the still small voice in my heart say, "Be still and know I am your God". Peace, home, joy. No words needed. Just be still.

I was home again! My physical and spiritual hiatus was over. I sat and let the peace that only God can give fill my inner core. I smiled as quiet tears rolled down my face hidden under my mask. 


