Dear Friends,

I'm writing from West Virginia Monday the 13th, where I'm about to start a retreat for priests which I do every year. By the time you read this I'll be back in Brewster for the weekend. Hopefully refreshed and spiritually renewed. After the past few months, we all probably find ourselves dragging a bit spiritually – quarantine and all the precautions have made us tired. We all need to renew our focus on Jesus and make sure we have him in the center.

Gradually we're hopefully getting back to normal. I did our first wedding post quarantine. Ironically it was a couple who were getting married in New Jersey but their wedding venue cancelled, so they just did the wedding vows closer to home. That was good to see – the sacrament meant so much to them that even when the party and the celebration was all taken away from them, they still knew what was most important: God's blessing on their new married life together.

We're back to doing baptisms, and all the sacraments. Our parish center is opening cautiously for parish activities, with some precautions for health and hygiene. We're conscious that the biggest priority is our personal relationship with Jesus, but we have to be careful to follow safe guidelines. We're starting with summer camp for kids and adult faith formation for adults too. Check it out in this bulletin.

Every week more people are trickling back to Church in our **Welcome Home Series**. Last week we honored and prayed for all who lost loved ones during the pandemic and everyone affected by it. **This week we'll honor first responders and essential workers and healthcare workers** – **the heroes of the pandemic.** Next week we'll welcome into full communion with the Church those who have been preparing for the sacraments and were delayed in receiving baptism, Holy Communion, or Confirmation.



Every week will be a different celebration, so come on in!

We're still spacing people out in church and overflow watches the LIVESTREAM in the gym next door and receive Communion. Some folks for now prefer attending the 8:30 am Monday through Friday daily Mass, or 7:00 pm on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday where attendance is smaller. Whichever you prefer, the important thing is to get back to Communion and get closer to Jesus.







I was asked several weeks ago to see if I would be interested in taking on an hour as an Adoration Guardian by Lynda Holler. I was somewhat hesitant due to the Pandemic as I had not been in Church during this time. Lynda reassured me that the Church was cleaned and sanitized

On a beautiful, warm, and sunny Saturday morning, nearly



seventy-five St Lawrence parishioners joined together in prayer and song on the lawn of our brother in Christ, Michael Brady. This team of prayer warriors gathered to lift their hearts to God in prayers of praise and thanksgiving and to ask for healing for Michael.

Michael's great faith and dedication are known to many at St Lawrence in the countless ways he serves the Church. As a sacristan, the Knights of Columbus, Eucharistic

Minister, Stephen's Minister, Third Order Franciscan, and member of Men's Ministry, to name a few. Mike's kindness, humility and sense of humor have made him a friend to many. So it comes as no surprise that when word went out that Mike needed prayers during his time of illness, a large number of people responded to offer prayers joyfully.

Scripture tells us that in times of sickness, we should pray for those who need healing. Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise. Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the Church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven. James 5:13-15

Our prayers for Michael on this sunny day came in many forms. Music minister Jeff Mazzone led the group in hymns of praise, the group prayed and sang along. Julie led the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Several people offered spontaneous prayers of encouragement, and Peg Smith led a decade of the Rosary. During the gathering, many reflected on how Michael has

helped them grow closer to God through his strong faith life. Lynda shared the insight that other holy people have experienced physical trials through painful illnesses, and Michael's experience has followed this pattern.

Michael was very grateful for the prayer and thanked the group. Several people prayed individually and in small groups with Michael. The outpouring of God's love for our brother Michael was abundantly present.

We are taught and told that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. Did it take a pandemic to drill it into my head? Maybe!

It may sound corny, but the ritual I missed most during the height of the Covid pandemic was not going to the gym, socializing with friends, or seeing my kids. It was Sunday Mass. I was not


furloughed as many were during this time, and I worked full time throughout the crisis. I am a nurse here in Putnam with a regular day shift position in Ambulatory Surgery. Because all non-urgent surgeries were cancelled, this meant I was sent to other areas of the hospital such as ICU, ER and other units in need of support. It was during the first weeks, when the intensity of the crisis was the highest, that I missed praying with our community the most. I was frightened that I would get sick, depressed by the illness and death I was witnessing (and feeling very unable to help or heal anyone), and feeling like a pariah because of my exposure to the Covid-19 virus. It was at this time that Fr. Rich heard my confession and allowed me to receive the Eucharist. It would be a couple of months, like all of us, that I would receive our Lord again. Although I listened to our parish Mass every Sunday, sitting in a cozy chair wearing PJ's and drinking coffee was just not the same experience.

Going back for that first Saturday afternoon Mass brought a flood on unanticipated and unexpected emotions. My tears started from the moment Fr. Rich kissed the altar. They slowed intermittently, but woosh! They started again after receiving Communion as I recalled the events of the past few months; most assuredly the most challenging point in my 40-year nursing career. Visions of the patients I cared for, several who passed from the virus, the staff I was privileged to work with and learn from (I did not have critical care experience-until Covid), and the many acts of support and kindness I experienced from my family and friends all seemed to come to the forefront of my memory. I think this was an incredible healing experience for me. I'm not a mushy person (how many nurses are?), but I'm pretty sure Jesus entered into my heart and allowed me to feel His presence that day. That doesn't always happen when we receive Holy Communion, but when we are able to experience it, it's awesome. I truly felt like I was home again, where I belong.




