

What are their future kids and grandkids fifty years from now going to think when they look back at those old family photos? Strange times indeed.

We've lost some members of our parish family to the virus and we entrust them to the good mercy of God for eternal peace. Some have lost jobs or are worried that they will. We'll get through this together with faith in God.

Life has been disrupted in so many ways since the lockdown in March and then our gradual re-opening in June. We've all learned to mask up and be careful, and we're sanitizing the churches and keeping worship to 50% capacity. We've learned Zooming and staying connected online like never before. And our Flocknotes have become a powerful way for us to communicate with our parishioners, in addition to our Facebook page.

Parish life has gotten complicated for sure. I'm proud of our parish staff for stepping up and keeping everyone connected. And I'm grateful that the Holy Spirit keeps on inspiring new ways for us to come together and to renew our faith and our commitment to God. Some great new stuff:

We're doing **Outdoor Masses** in different neighborhoods as long as the weather is good. We've managed to bring in more and more people to Eucharistic Adoration and now we are at **24/7 Perpetual Adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament**. We've kept **Confessions** going and **Seasons of Praise Holy Hours**. Our **Early Childhood Center** has record numbers of preK kids this year. We've increased our **Faith Formation Programs** and added "at home" options on Zoom, potentially reaching even more people. We've switched our **Family Program** and **Edge** religious education to online as well. We've added coffee and donuts after Mass and offer T-Shirts, hats and masks with the parish logo and the community spirit is growing.

A Page from Our History:

the beginning of sacred heart church

Long time Putnam Lakers will know that it was the Daily Mirror, a New York newspaper that initiated a real estate development of the area in the 1920's. Many from the city built summer homes around the lake - nearly 2000 homes altogether. Spencer and Margaret Hance had lived there since 1920 and realized that the summer Catholic crowd would have a difficult time getting to Mass at St. Lawrence O'Toole.

In 1933, they ap-

proached Fr. Lawrence Costello, the pastor, and offered to build a small chapel on their land if he would send a priest on weekends. Fr. Costello embraced the idea and the Hances got working. A priest would journey from St. Lawrence each Sunday for Mass first in Towners at a chapel called St. Bernard's, then over to Putnam Lake for two Masses at 9:00 am and 11:00 am. The small gothic church was erected by the summer of 1934, and over 300 people would attend each weekend. Spencer Hance, himself a convert to Catholicism, did almost all the construction work. The Hances donated the Church and the land and others helped with the furnishing and vestments. Fr. Costello prevailed upon Cardinal Hayes to travel from the city for the dedication of the new Church on September 23, 1934. He then went to St. Lawrence to bless the new wing of the school and a new section of the cemetery. Fr. Costello tragically passed away of a heart attack a week later. He is buried in St. Lawrence Cemetery.

The Hances died within several years of the Church's completion, happy to leave a legacy of faith and love. Their wish was to be buried near the Church, and we have recently located their gravesite. Sadly, on September 6, 1942 a fire broke out during the night and the Church of the Sacred Heart was completely destroyed.

Mass continued in the former home of the Hances, with people lined up outdoors. In 1953 a group from the Church approached then pastor Fr. Joseph Heaney with the proposal to build a new church. Money was scarce and St. Lawrence was in the middle of a campaign to expand the school. He gave them a challenge to raise \$20,000 for the construction and within a week they dropped the cash on his desk! Then they got to work in 1954, building the present Church of the Sacred Heart.

To honor the vision and drive and the generosity of Spencer and Margaret Hance, we are going to erect a fitting monument on the site of the original church, as well as a lasting headstone to this wonderful couple that made Sacred Heart a reality.

Our vision at St. Lawrence O'Toole Church is proudly posted at the top of Father Gill's letter in each week's bulletin: Create a parish of missionary disciples whose personal relationship with Jesus Christ inspires others into a life-changing relationship with Him.

Many of us have been attending Mass our whole lives but may not really understand what that statement means. I am a cradle Catholic that attended church and prayed regularly my whole life, but it has only been over the last 11 years that I came to more deeply understand the meaning of being Jesus' disciple and the enormous potential that life offers when we have a personal relationship with Him. This new weekly column will help to draw you closer to Jesus and help to reveal the way to becoming his disciple. First, we must consider the meaning of that word; it is often misunderstood. A disciple is simply a *student*.

The Jews have a saying that goes something like: "May you follow so closely that you be covered in the dust of your rabbi." Jesus' first disciples ate, drank, walked, talked, laughed, and cried with Him. They lived life with him, so that his ways become their ways.

That's what we need to do: learn Jesus' ways so intimately that we live our lives as he would if he was living our life. What choices would he make? What would his relationships look like? How would he spend his day as a mother, father, student, plumber, real estate agent...

Each week I will post a message, a Scripture reading, and a Call to Action to encourage you to learn and grow in your faith.

This week: Scripture: Ephesians 5:1

Call to Action: Think about what Jesus would do if he was walking in your shoes this week, not just when making the big decisions, but also with the little things, the mundane actions and interactions.

I look forward to discovering *the way to Jesus* along with you and coming to recognize each of you by your dust!

We have 17 Stephen Ministers who with care and the grace of God, brought healing to their care receivers. Fr. Rich will commission 11 additional Stephen Ministers on Oct. 18 at 9:30 am Mass.

We all struggle. I have cared for, prayed with and held hands of people who needed help. I often think of the people who have no one. Fr. Rich brought Stephen Ministers to us. God puts people where he wants them.

Pura Melendez, a Stephen Minister commented "It is what Jesus has been trying to teach the world. . .".

Stephen Minister, Janice Nastasi, said, "The most rewarding experience is praying with your care receiver. After she passed, I received a beautiful note from her family, thanking me for taking the time to visit and pray with their mom". Also, Robin Liguori a Stephen Minister reflected "My care receiver who passed 5 months after our first visit, left a huge impact on me. I will remain forever grateful for the joy and knowledge she brought to me, and I thank God for putting her in my life"

Stephen Ministery has touched the hearts of many and has brought people back to prayer and church, closer to their families and lessened burdens. A care receiver who lost her job said, "I felt like I had a 2000 piece jigsaw puzzle in front of me and had no idea where to begin". Her Stephen Minister helped her put that puzzle back together.

We are not professionals, but parishioners of this parish. We pray with them, listen to them, laugh with them and care for them. They lean on us until they get stronger and learn to lean on God.

If you know of someone who is struggling, please call the rectory at 845-279-2021 and they will connect you to us. A kind word, a simple prayer, and time spent with someone who is hurting can make all the difference in the world. That is what we do. We minister to the needs of others, like Jesus taught us.
