Dear Friends,

1. The Gospel last Sunday reminded us about our obligations first of all to God above all, even in the political environment in which we live. When the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus, he responded by saying "render unto Caesar that which is Caesar's, and to God that which is God's". For us Catholics, our duties to God always come first.

It underscores the importance as we approach an important election of forming a Catholic conscience and making sure our values reflect what God wants of us. There's no substitute for a well-formed conscience and prayer to the Holy Spirit to enlighten us as to what the priorities he is setting for us. For us Catholics, the sanctity of every human life is fundamental, as is the right to religious liberty. Our other rights and responsibilities flow from these.

I encourage you all to pray to the Holy Spirit for light and for wisdom as we approach our elections and vote according to a well-formed Catholic conscience always.

2. A week from Monday we celebrate **All Soul's Day, November 2**. It always reminds me I should be praying more for the faithful departed and all souls – many are in Purgatory and just need our prayers to get to Heaven. Praying for them is a duty of our charity. And we hope that someone will pray for us when we are in Purgatory too. We'll be celebrating a Mass at St. Lawrence Cemetery at 4:00 that day to pray for all your loved ones, and all those who are buried on that sacred ground. Join us...



3. This is as good a time as ever to remind everyone that as Catholics, we treat the remains of the deceased with the utmost respect. Even if the family decides on cremation, there should be a funeral Mass and prayers for the deceased, and then a burial in a Catholic cemetery of the cremains. They can also be interred in a Columbarium above ground, but they should always be put to rest in sacred ground. Cremains can never remain in a house or in storage – that is completely disrespectful of the dead. If you have cremains in your home, please contact our Cemetery Office and arrange for a dignified burial out of respect for your loved ones.

4. In addition to annual meal delivery run by the Franciscans and the Knights around Brewster, a group of parishioners will be going down **Thanksgiving Day** to the Bronx to serve the homeless around St. Anthony of Padua parish in a very poor area. The parish has asked for our help in reaching hundreds of homeless in their area. Sign up on the website if you're interested...



Series 1:

Community 2 – Who is Your Elizabeth?

One of my favorite scenes in the Bible is when Mary travels to the hill country to stay with her kinswoman Elizabeth after her visit from Angel Gabriel. Mary had just agreed to be the mother

of God and learned that her aged cousin Elizabeth was miraculously pregnant too.

Homilies often teach us of the generosity of Mary in wanting to help Elizabeth. That is an important message, but I have always looked at it a little differently. Mary just encountered an angel, agreed to a role with no clear understanding of what it would look like, and then learned that her cousin had been chosen for a special role too.

God chose two women from the same family, in the same period of history, to be special contributors to his story of salvation. I don't think that was a coincidence. I think Mary ran to Elizabeth because she was the only other person on earth that she could talk to openly about this experience. They were both faithful women, pregnant in extraordinary ways. Who else could they talk to as candidly about their excitement, fears, joys, and doubts?

The three months that these faithful women lived together, helping each other physically, emotionally, and spiritually, was instrumental in preparing them for the next phase of their journeys.

We each need our own Elizabeth. Our faith communities are meant to nurture our spiritual growth, to support and advise us in spiritual matters just as we need mentors in other areas of our life.

When you have questions, doubts, when you want to talk about your faith, who is your Elizabeth?

Scripture: This week, read Luke 1:39-45. What is it saying to you?

Call to Action: Pray each day asking God to lead you to your Elizabeth. If you have one, speak to them regularly. If not, you may need to start meeting people at church so you can find the person that you connect with, your kinsperson, in blood or in spirit.
