












The Eucharistic Miracles of the World Nov 15, 22

miracles of the eucharist

Throughout history and in all corners of the globe, people have reported miracles that brought them back to the truth. Carlo Acutis, an Italian teenager, had a passionate love for the Blessed Sacrament and was inspired to travel around the world documenting the well over one hundred Eucharistic Miracles that the Church has recognized. He photographed and chronicled them on a website and in poster form so God's proofs could be exhibited and help Catholics come to love Jesus as intimately as he did. Carlo died of leukemia at the age of 15 and was beatified last month, on October 10, 2020.

We are excited to be hosting a large selection of the miracles in an exhibit at St. Lawrence O'Toole from November 8 - 22. Our gym is lined with over 90 posters that reveal how God wants us to understand and believe.

There are miracles from over 19 countries, that involve regular people, saints, and our Blessed Mother. There are also examples of animal reverencing the Blessed Sacrament!

You can access the gym at any time from the Adoration Chapel side and the lights are motion sensitive, so even at night you can explore the exhibit. We encourage you to take time over the next 2 weeks to read through the posters carefully and pray on the instances that touch your heart most closely. Use this opportunity to come to understand and love the Blessed Sacrament as passionately as Carlo did.

Dear Friends,

Two weeks ago I introduced our **Parish Improvement Program** for Sacred Heart that will beautify the Church and grounds and take care of some badly needed projects. Already people have stepped forward to commit to the program, and we are more than 60% the way to our goal of \$135,000! Our people love Sacred Heart and they show it.

Results have been so encouraging so I have engaged a company to repair the parish center gutters to protect the building. Work is underway! I've also ordered the monuments that will mark the spot of the original Sacred Heart Chapel and the burial site of Spencer and Margaret Hance, who built the church and donated their land and home. We also have in the works the outdoor Stations of the Cross.

If the campaign goes well, expect to see progress on all the five projects over the next several months. Make a pledge today to keep Sacred Heart Strong!

One of the exciting things we'll do as a parish this **Thanksgiving** is expand our outreach to the poor. Our Knights of Columbus and Franciscan group always run a meal distribution program for the needy, and that is continuing this year with some adaptations for the pandemic.

But we wanted to do more, and our sister parish in the Bronx, **St. Anthony of Padua** has invited us to help serve 500 homeless people in shelters around the Bronx. We'll be taking a group of volunteers down that morning to spend a day in the kitchen preparing and delivering meals along with the parishioners of St. Anthony's. Sign up today at **stlawrenceotoole.org/Thanksgiving** to join us for a unique and beautiful Thanksgiving experience.

We're also going to cover the costs of the meals for St. Anthony's homeless, so anything you can give in our **parish fund for missions and the poor** this month will go toward that. Thank you for your generosity and love for the poorest among us.

JULIE NOCE

A large banner spans the side of the church announcing "It's Comeback Time" and I could almost hear the pastor, Father Joe Espaillat's, voice in my head as we drive up to St. Anthony of Padua in the Bronx, our sister parish. They, like us, along with many other parishes in this Archdiocese, were hit hard by the pandemic and are struggling to find ways to bring their people back to Mass. I hear sirens all around us; it's dark, but I can see people pushing their belongings down the street; in contrast, St. Anthony's is well lit, looming large with the doors wide open: a beacon of light in this troubled neighborhood. After having our temperatures taken, we are escorted into a large, recently renovated meeting space and greeted by several more warm welcoming friends who smile brightly with their eyes.

One teenage girl excitedly shows us two example gift packs of hygiene products that she wants to give to the 500 homeless people we will serve meals to on Thanksgiving Day. Her joy is infectious, and as she describes these items she mentions in passing "when I was homeless" and my heart drops. This beautiful, bright joyful teenager purchasing gifts for homeless people has experienced homelessness. Another women, who works for one of the many rehabilitation centers in this area as a cook, is proud to say that she already received approval from her boss to use his pots to make the rice for the day and she will start cooking at 2 am because her work shift that day begins at 5 am. These people are truly giving "from their substance" like Jesus says of the poor widow in Scripture. I'm seated next to the Vice President of Shelters for New York City, who tells us that there are twelve thousand families applying for shelter in NYC – yes, there are children living on our streets. She stays awake worrying about how she will feed her families, and as a woman of faith she prays daily.

So our commitment to feed two of the many shelters in her care during a pandemic on **Thanksgiving Day is a miracle**: we have been the answer to her prayers.

We have been united by the Holy Spirit to be the hands and feet of Christ to the poor. I'm overwhelmed with pride as Fr. Joe's booming voice says "This is Church, People! This is What We Do!".

FOUR WAYS TO HELP:

- 1. Providing funding to purchase the turkeys, pork, and ground beef for Thanksgiving dinners that these brothers and sisters in Christ otherwise would not have. Maybe you can give...
- 2. We will provide gift bags with essential cleaning products for each of them. We'll be packing the bags on Sunday, Nov. 22 at 2:00 pm in the gym. Come and provide some manpower bagging!
- 3. We'll also **donate non-perishable food goods** to their local area food pantry: items like rice, beans and other canned goods. If you can donate some of these items, drop them off at the church entrance at St. Lawrence O'Toole and Sacred Heart by the end of Masses on Sunday, Nov. 22.
- 4. We'll also go in person to volunteer and work on Thanksgiving.





Series 1: Community #5 You are an important part of the Body of Christ.

When we are baptized in Christ, we enter into God's family. As part of God's family, Jesus is the head and each of us are a piece of his

body. When we all take part and worship together as He ordains, the body works effortlessly. But when people fail to honor God and do their part, it leaves a gaping hole in Jesus' body. Here is a visual that helps me understand this mystery.

My sons went to JFK Elementary School and the school photographer created an image that combined the individual

photos of the students and a large picture of the school building. From a distance all we could see was the school, but up close we saw each of the individual children. I could pick out my sons and their friends. If one of those children took a scissor and cut his picture out, it would ruin the whole image. It would be incomplete and weaken the structure making it more likely to tear. That is how I envision the Body of Christ. Here on earth we are so close that all we can see are the people, but if we were to view the Christian Community from a distance, like from heaven, we would not see individuals, but Jesus's body.

When we do not fulfill our role in God's kingdom, the whole body suffers. The more people missing, the more the structure is weakened because it is missing the specific gifts that the body needs to thrive. We know that it won't crumble, because Jesus cannot be defeated or destroyed, but all of the members are affected by the sins and omissions of the rest. Our lives will be fuller and richer with a healthy, robust body.

Scripture: Read Romans 12:3-8, every day if possible. What is it saying to you?

Call to Action: Consider your gifts.

What are you particularly good at? Are you using your gifts to their fullest for the Kingdom of God? How might you make Jesus' body stronger?


