### the man of the shroud

The Shroud of Turin has long been venerated by the faithful and is believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus of Nazareth. The Shroud is one of the most scientifically studied religious icons in history. As science has progressed, so has the speculation on how the image of the crucified man of the Shroud was made.

The exhibit presents the results of a comprehensive scientific, historical and forensic study with numerous photographs and illustrations. The exhibit is the work of the Center for the Study of the Passion of Christ and the Holy Shroud and Monsignor Giulio Ricci and other scientists, who spent more than 25 years researching the Holy Shroud.

The centerpiece of the exhibit is a full-length replica of the Shroud developed from a photographic image of the Shroud made by the Eastman Kodak Co. The replica shows the front and back of the shroud. In addition, the mobile exhibit contains a large crucified corpus showing the wounds of Christ corresponding to the passion narrative in the Gospel accounts and the wounds shown on the Shroud. The exhibit contains 66 panels detailing the history and science of the Shroud.

His presentation will cover the history and science of The Shroud, and demonstrate how the image is a valuable reflection of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord, as well as a reflection of the Gospels. Sean lives with his wife of 29 years, and 5 children, in Highland, NY. Social distancing and face coverings are required.

The former non-profit went out of business leaving a void for the dozens of homeless persons living in the woods around the reservoirs. # thanksgiving here and in the bronx

The enormous outpouring of money, food, and supplies from our generous parishioners filled the beds and back seats of five pickup trucks and the caravan made its first run on Tuesday night. We helped other St. Lawrence and St. Anthony parishioners unload the supplies desperately needed for their local food bank. We also delivered the 500 packs of cleaning supplies for homeless families that had been compiled in our gym by other volunteers the previous Sunday.

### Serving in the Bronx

On Thanksgiving Day, I had the privilege of accompanying about 50 other parishioners and Fr. Gill to our sister parish in the Bronx, St. Anthony of Padua. Thinking I knew what to expect since we were going to help with packaging meals for the homeless and homebound, the experience proved to be so much more than just that. The organization of this undertaking clearly showed that this was not the first time these folks had done something of this nature. All the supplies were ready for the dozens and dozens of St. Anthony parishioners who worked in shifts: through the night to cook the meals for more than 600 people, in the morning to package the meals, in the afternoon to deliver the meals and finally a crew that stayed behind to do the clean-up. That alone was impressive, but it was by no means the highlight of the day.

I met a lovely woman there named Josie who told me it was "all for the glory of God". Those weren't just words, they were backed by the dedication of everyone there. You felt the presence of the Holy Spirit in the room and knew that these people believed with all their heart and soul. Once everything was packed and ready to go, Fr. Gill officiated at a Mass in their beautiful church. You could feel faith alive in that church, in those people, in their prayers and in their singing. St. Anthony's is a poor parish by financial standards, but they are very rich in faith and works. We witnessed their annual Thanksgiving Day tradition of presenting gifts of food during the offertory (instead of taking up a collection). People lined up to offer their gifts individually, generously giving of what they had. It struck me that the less people had, the more willingly they gave. Am I that willing to give?

Sometimes, a word or two from someone touches us. Sometimes, it's not even a word but a kind gesture or action. This day it was all those things. I think there was an important lesson to be learned from our brothers and sisters at St. Anthony's, and that lesson was one more thing to be thankful for this Thanksgiving.

### Thanksgiving for our local Homebound

Here at St Lawrence over 50 volunteers helped in preparing, cooking, baking, packaging and delivering. The volunteers practiced social distancing and wore masks. Our drivers picked up the meals at curbside in front of the Parish Center and more than two hundred meals were delivered on Thanksgiving to the Brewster, Carmel, Patterson and Mahopac areas.



### guidance on Covid vaccine

Fr. Tom Berg is a moral theologian and specialist in bioethical issues. I asked him whether we should be concerned about any ethical issues involved in taking the Coronavirus vaccines. His judgment and that of most Catholic moral theologians is that the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are not morally problematic.

"The rapid development of Covid vaccines raises the perennial question of whether it is acceptable to receive vaccines that, in their production, have relied to some degree on human cells historically derived from aborted fetuses.

These cell lines were derived many years ago from post-abortion fetal tissue. Examples: HEK-293, MRC-5 and WR-38 were generated from abortions that occurred in the 1960s and 1970s. HEK cells, for example, are kidney cells from the aborted fetus. They are routinely used in research today--almost without thought.

With regard to the two leading candidate vaccines (one produced by Pfizer, the other by Moderna), there is much good news. Given the technology used, there is no need for a culture medium, no need for live cell cultures, etc.

Instead of using live or diminished Covid virus to generate an immune response, these vaccines rely on coronavirus outer spike proteins, which are what antibodies use to recognize the virus. Researchers use the genetic code that coronavirus uses to produce spike proteins. They employ molecules called RNA to transport this synthetically made genetic information into our cells. When injected into a patient, the RNA enters healthy cells where it helps orchestrate the production of coronavirus spike proteins. Once in the system, this prompts the body to create antibodies. This same technology is currently used in cancer therapy to genetically target specific cancers. There is no use of any fetal tissue in the actual process or production of the vaccine itself."

The bottom line is Catholics should feel it is morally right to take the vaccine when it becomes available.

Series 2: Obedience #3 – The Cookie Jar My parents were loving and patient, so a rare memory of my father's anger remains vivid: My mother had told me that I couldn't have a cookie. Without her knowing, I asked Dad and he approved. Perfect! I got permission and the

cookie! Then they talked... Dad made it clear that his permission didn't justify disobeying Mom; I was punished.

I think the cookie jar analogy is perfect in reflecting on obedience to God. We often seem to think that as long as we can get what we want without getting caught, it is okay, even though it means disobedience. We may convince ourselves that God doesn't know or care that we are taking forbidden cookies because we do not see his response or receive an immediate punishment.

Adam and Eve eating the forbidden fruit, thinking God wouldn't know, models the serious ramifications of disobedience. Along with losing their beautiful home and intimate relationship with God, they also lost their innocence. By eating from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, they came to truly learn what evil was and its painful contrast to good. God had hoped to protect them from that.

The same thing happens when we sin, right? Teenagers that defy their parents' rules and associate with forbidden people and activities lose innocence that they can never regain. The same with adults that partake in sexual and moral sins; they can never return to their previous innocence. All sin separates us from God, little by little.

As disciples, we must acknowledge that we sin and humbly turn to God in Confession. He clearly knows our every action, punishment is inevitable, unless we turn to Him first. He has promised that through the Sacrament of Reconciliation our sins are both forgiven and forgotten. Let us earnestly trust Him and chose The Way of obedience and reconciliation.

## surviving the holidays

The holidays can be a challenging time for those who are grieving. The thought of celebrating without our loved ones can be emotionally overwhelming. Thankfully, we don't have to face the holiday season alone.

On November 15 th, St. Lawrence's Bereavement Ministry hosted its third annual "Surviving the Holidays" event, a GriefShare seminar focused on practical survival tips and perspectives of those who have navigated the holidays without their loved ones. The large conference room was festooned with flowers, pumpkins and cheerful fall decorations, and participants took home fall-themed gifts and treats.

Despite a power outage that threatened to derail the evening, the night was deemed a success by all. In-person participants watched the planned video on a battery-powered laptop, and Zoom participants watched online. Just as the candles were found, power was restored. After the video, participants discussed in groups their feelings about the upcoming holidays. Some suggested honoring their loved ones by lighting a candle. Others discussed creating new traditions instead of focusing on traditions they have lost. Most importantly, we learned that it is possible to enjoy the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons again.

St. Lawrence O'Toole's **From Mourning to Joy** Bereavement program is a 13-week grief support group that meets year-round every Tuesday from 7-9pm in the New York Room and on Zoom. Anyone interested is welcome to join at any time during the program, and as often as they need. Personally, I have been attending GriefShare meetings since losing my mother in October of 2019 and am so grateful for the fellowship I've found. These meetings allow me to grieve my mother with others who truly understand the pain and challenges of deep, life-altering loss. I have benefited so much from the wisdom of those in the Bereavement Ministry that I have joined the team myself and am co-facilitating the current program. We hope you will join us.
