



Series 3: Which Way? The Rugged Road

I am convinced that everyone experiences challenges and suffering in their lives. We may look at some people and think that they have skated through easily because they don't talk about or we haven't witnessed their adversities. But

some neighbors that seem to have it all now, may have grown up in abusive homes or poverty, they may be living in dysfunctional relationships or are plagued by addiction or burdened by unfulfilling jobs. The deeper query is: which way is our suffering leading us?

Blessed Henry Suso said, "Suffering gives a man wisdom and experience. A man who has not suffered, what does he know?"

Some people are determined to avoid suffering at all costs. That wasn't Jesus' way and it can't be ours. He makes it clear that the road to heaven is not the one we might expect.

Jesus says, "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few."

We witness people choosing the immoral, smooth road instead of the righteous, rugged one over and over. Life is messy and the broad road that appears to avoid discomfort and hardship can be tempting. But there is satisfaction that comes from taking the high road and pushing our character beyond normal limits and by obtaining the wisdom and experience promised by Suso. The devil will tell us that we are not strong enough for the rugged road, but as Christians, we know better. Jesus will guide our conscience, help us embrace our cross, and step forward with us as we choose his way, the way to life.

Scripture: Read Matthew 7:13-14. Reflect on what God is saying to you.

Call to Action: Consider the road you are on. Have you accepted your suffering and allowed Jesus to use it to draw you closer to Him? If not, what changes can you make?

I've loved every minute of being a priest in all these 30 years. But the best part has been the years I've spent in Brewster and Patterson as pastor of two wonderful, faith-filled parishes. I thank you all for allowing me to serve you, and for your patience with all my shortcomings. I apologize for anytime I may have been an obstacle for some in finding their way to God and his mercy.

I hope that somehow through my ministry people have come closer to Jesus that in the balance, it was positive.

I've also seen how fragile we are and I thank God that despite my many faults and weaknesses I have been able to remain in his service. I pray every day that I be given that greatest of graces, to persevere to the end of my days in love and in the service of God and his people. I so want to hear him say those words, "well done, good and faithful servant...".

If you can, I'd ask you to offer a little prayer for me to persevere firmly to the end.







the man of the shroud

St. Lawrence is privileged to exhibit the Shroud of Turin. Sean Fitzgerald, an expert on its existence, recently spoke. The Holy Shroud is a length of linen cloth bearing the negative image of a man. Millions claim the image depicts Jesus of Nazareth and the fabric is the burial shroud in which Jesus was wrapped after his crucifixion. Mr. Fitzgerald

explained in detail how science, history, scripture and faith all came together and how this piece of linen cloth told the story of all Jesus endured for us.

His opening statement "The Shroud received much controversy because it wrapped a man who said he was God", got my attention. I listened as he brought the Shroud alive and the story it told of the horrific torture, scourging and crucifixion Jesus underwent. I learned that Jesus received over 200 floggings, not 40, because it was Romans inflicting the pain, not the Jews. I learned The Shroud of Turin Research Project examined the Shroud and found the markings on the cloth consistent with a crucified body and stains were real human blood. The images contain markings that correspond to the crucifixion wounds of Jesus including thorn marks on

his head, lacerations from flogging, bruises on his shoulders and blood stains. As he spoke, I followed his descriptions on the replica present.


C.S. Lewis popularized the argument that Jesus was either a liar, a lunatic or the Son of God. We are asked to choose. If he is not a liar or lunatic, he is the Son of God. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life".

The Holy Shroud's authenticity is in the eye of the believer. To me, it tells the story of the last several hours of a man who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, sent to us by God and who I call Jesus. After Jesus rose from the dead, he appeared before his disciples and Mary. He gave them that gift. The Holy Shroud that survived a fire and protected by bullet-proof glass in Italy, is a gift that Jesus left for us.

As Mr. Fitzgerald spoke in fine detail of every mark on the Shroud I could only image each and every wound Jesus sustained for us. Yet, I also felt the enormous love in that



linen cloth. It is an amazing exhibit told in a very powerful way of a man who after more than 2000 years has changed the world and remains the central figure of the human race.



pope francis proclaims "year of st. joseph"

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from December 8, 2020, to December 8, 2021.



the power of the sleeping st. joseph

The Lord spoke to Joseph three times through dreams. First, when Joseph had decided to quietly divorce Mary after learning of her pregnancy—itself a merciful decision that defied custom—an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said: "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She is to bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." -Matthew 1:20-21

The scripture emphasizes, "When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home" (Matthew 1:24).

Two more times "the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream." Once, when God told Joseph to flee to Egypt to protect the infant Jesus from Herod (Matthew 2:13-14). Another time was when the Lord called Joseph to bring Jesus back to the land of Israel (Matthew 2:19-21). Immediately after God spoke to Joseph, he responded exactly as he was told.

St. Joseph Teaches Us to Rest

One thing I have often overlooked is the fact that the Lord spoke to Joseph when he was in a state of complete rest. This realization struck me particularly hard because this year the "word of the year" I received from a word generator was rest.

The past few years of my life have been rife with intense undertakings. I also struggle with insomnia, so the word "rest" has both physical and spiritual implications for me. Once again, St. Joseph is nurturing me, teaching me, and giving me a silent example of the disposition to assume before the Lord.

When Joseph was faced with the dilemma of an inexplicably pregnant wife, we can assume he worked out the solution of a quiet divorce with great care and discernment, for Scripture reveals that he "was a righteous man" (Matthew 1:19).

Yet God penetrated Joseph in a vulnerable moment, in a period of rest, to show him another way. No matter how carefully Joseph strove to find a solution while he was awake and alert, God revealed to him the wonderful plan of salvation while he was resting.

Sleep Implies Trust—Not only was Joseph able to receive God's astonishing plan, but he received God's plan through the precarious means of a dream. He trusted the message, and he trusted the means in which God gave him direction.

Joseph's trust indicates his strong faith and his deep intimacy with the Lord. Joseph knew it was the Lord speaking to him. He was familiar with God's voice in his life, which means he must have had a deep, consistent prayer life. It's not enough to just rest, either spiritually or physically. We must know who we are resting with, or rather who we are resting in.

While I've never received a message from the Lord in a dream, when I do sense God speaking to me, I often wonder if I am just imagining things. Or I question whether the prompting is true. I doubt the Spirit and hesitate to act. Yet Joseph awoke assured, ready to respond. He showed a holy animation, inspired and generated during a period of rest, that only comes from deep communion with God.

Intimacy with God—For me, the sleeping St. Joseph image is a model of the trusting, familial, vulnerable attitude I am called to have before the Lord. My prayer, under the tutelage of St. Joseph, is that I can develop a deep intimacy with God along with the ability to rest, so that when God speaks to me in my rest, I can trust His word and readily respond. I pray to follow Joseph's example upon awakening, allowing the Spirit to animate me into holy action that realizes God's divine plan in my life.
