



Series 4, The Divine Conductor – The Nativity



In our Father's magnificent Symphony of Salvation, the Nativity is undoubtedly the greatest movement to date. The incamation of his only Son, born of a virgin in a cave far from her home, accompanied only by her husband, surrounded by animals, and visited first by angels and shep-

herds. Unprecedented. And for it to be successful, it was essential that each participant follows the Divine Conductor in perfect obedience and trust.

While pondering the Nativity this Advent, I received additional insight as to why God directed the story the way He did. Mary and

Joseph settled on a cave for shelter, and we can learn from their poverty and humility. Indeed, we do, but I suggest that God chose that cave particularly to honor Mary and Joseph.

Imagine if Mary and Joseph got the last room at a crowded inn. Think of the noise: children running, people singing, yelling, arguing, doors slamming... Not a peaceful atmosphere for young parents to welcome the newborn king.

And think about it: what is the first thing 1st century women would do if another showed up ready to give birth? Of course, the midwives would usher in and Joseph would be ushered out! Not only would that scenario ruin the intimacy that Mary and Joseph ultimately experienced, but it could not support the amazing way Jesus was to be born.

The Catholic Church teaches that Mary did not give birth in the normal way because Mary was born without original sin. The pain of childbirth was a direct result of Eve's disobedience, God shielded her from that. This birth also allowed Mary to maintain her perpetual virginity. God did not want this miraculous birth witnessed by the residents of Bethlehem, so the cave was perfect. Mary and Joseph were alone in the quiet night with angels attending to the birth of their Son. Assuredly not the way that Mary and Joseph had imagined, but a far more awesome way.

Scripture: Read Luke 2:6-7. What is God saying to you.

We persevere. We keep the faith. We are confident in the one who is greater than any power on earth.

The 33rd Psalm says it well:

"The Lord looks on those who revere him, on those who hope in his love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.

"Our soul is waiting on the Lord. The Lord is our help and our shield. In him do our hearts find joy. We trust in his holy name.

"May your love be upon us Lord, as we place all our hope in you."

Let's all make sure, that whatever else happens in these troubled times, that each one of us make 2021 a year in which we deepen our trust and our love for God. In the end, that's what matters most – for time, and for eternity.







church grants plenary indulgence for year of st. joseph

The Apostolic Penitentiary issues a Decree granting plenary indulgences for the year of St. Joseph proclaimed by Pope Francis. The special year will last from Dec 8, 2020 to Dec 8, 2021. The Pope announced a special year dedicated to St. Joseph on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of St. Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church. The Apostolic Penitentiary also issued a decree granting special indulgences for the duration of the special year to celebrate the anniversary and "to perpetuate the entrustment of the whole Church to the powerful patronage of the Custodian of Jesus."

During this period, the faithful will have the opportunity to commit themselves "with prayer and good works, to obtain, with the help of St. Joseph, head of the heavenly Family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from the serious human and social tribulations that besiege the contemporary world today."

Devotion to St. Joseph — The decree notes that devotion to St. Joseph has grown extensively throughout the history of the Church, "which not only attributes to him high reverence after that of the Mother of God his spouse but has also given him multiple patronages."

At the same time, the Magisterium of the Church continues to discover "old and new greatness in this treasure which is St. Joseph, like the master in the Gospel of Matthew who brings from his storeroom both the new and the old."

Conditions for the plenary indulgence —The plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions) to Christians who, with a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year of St. Joseph on these occasions and manners indicated by the Apostolic Penitentiary:

- •The plenary indulgence is granted to those who will meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer, or take part in a Spiritual Retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph. "St. Joseph, an authentic man of faith, invites us", the decree reads, "to rediscover our filial relationship with the Father, to renew fidelity to prayer, to listen and correspond with profound discernment to God's will."
- •The indulgence can also be obtained by those who, following St. Joseph's example, will perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy. St. Joseph "encourages us to rediscover the value of silence, prudence and loyalty in carrying out our duties," the decree notes.
- •The recitation of the Holy Rosary in families and among engaged couples is another way of obtaining indulgences, in order that "all Christian families may be stimulated to recreate the same atmosphere of intimate communion, love and prayer that was in the Holy Family."
- Everyone who entrusts their daily activity to the protection of St. Joseph, and every faithful who invokes the intercession of St. Joseph so that those seeking work can find dignifying work can also obtain the plenary indulgence.
- The plenary indulgence is also granted to the faithful who will recite the Litany to St. Joseph or any other prayer to St. Joseph proper to the other liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church, and for the relief of all Christians suffering all forms of persecution. Because, the decree notes, "the flight of the Holy Family to Egypt shows us that God is there where man is in danger, where man suffers, where he runs away, where he experiences rejection and abandonment."

A universal saint—In addition to these, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence to the faithful who will recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, for example, "To you, O blessed Joseph" especially on "19 March, on 1 May, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, on St. Joseph's Sunday (according to the Byzantine tradition) on the 19th of each month and every Wednesday, a day dedicated to the memory of the saint according to the Latin tradition."

The decree recalls the universality of St. Joseph's patronage of the Church, noting that St. Teresa of Ávila recognized him as "a protector for all the circumstances of life". Pope St. John Paul II also said that St. Joseph has "a renewed relevance for the Church of our time, in relation to the new Christian millennium."




