

Passion — Unlikely Disciples

It is beautiful and encouraging to see in both Scripture and real life how some of the most unlikely people are transformed into Jesus' disciples.

Last week we discussed how Simon of Cyrene was in the "wrong place at the wrong time" which led to his conversion. In Luke's Passion narrative, we read about the Good Thief, who admitted he deserved crucifixion but turned his life over to Jesus with the immortal words: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus' response, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in

Paradise," reveals to us how this repentant sinner was one of our first saints.

In Mark's Passion account read on Palm Sunday, we are introduced to the Roman centurion at the foot of the cross, who declared after Jesus breathed his last, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" Catholic tradition tells us his name is St. Longinus, a Roman who left the army, studied under the apostles, defied Roman governors with his bold witness, and ultimately martyred for his faith.

A Jew, a thief, and a Roman, three men who converted within the last hours of Jesus' life. Three disciples who discovered the way of Jesus differently: Simon used his physical strength to serve. The Good Thief began his relationship with repentance. The centurion took his first step by proclaiming boldly that Jesus is God.

There is no standard profile; the Holy Spirit has a special plan to lead each one of us to *The Way of Jesus*. Disciples differ from others because they are willing to surrender their own will and follow God's, knowing it will lead them to the ultimate goal of eternity in heaven with Jesus.

Scripture: Read Luke 23:39-43. What's it saying to you?

I have to admit it was depressing – on the day we usually have the biggest crowds, spilling over into the gym. But it was just the deacons that day and me.

In the afternoon, we rigged up Deacon Mark's pickup with a harness, and we drove the Blessed

Sacrament out to every neighborhood in the parish. A logistics team tipped off people in neighborhood after neighborhood, alerting them by text messages, as we drew near. Brewster Hill, North Brewster, Farm to Market, Foggintown, Enoch Crosby, Brewster Heights, Blackberry, Forest, Deans Corner, Allview, the Village, Milltown and Gage, Fieldstone Pond, Putnam Ridge, Haviland and the hillside in Putnam Lake. People under lockdowns were waiting on their lawns and streets with neighbors – wearing masks and socially distanced. People were on their knees as we passed with the Monstrance containing Jesus the Lord, blessing them and their families.



It was an awesome display of faith in hard times on the part of all our people. And despite the months of lockdowns and quarantines we never stopped having Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel. Jesus is the one who got us through it all.

This Easter we feel the plague is slowly passing away as vaccinations increase and more people have immunity. It has taken a huge toll with deaths, illness, loss of jobs and businesses, closed schools, and even on our mental health.


Now our people are coming back to worship with confidence and thanksgiving that God has led us through the hard times. If you're nervous about crowds, try out our 5:30 pm Sunday or 7:00 pm Wednesday night Masses – they are less crowded.

A heart on fire with the love of God is a heart in the state of grace. And what's the best way to be cleansed of all sin and punishment? Taking advantage of the extraordinary graces of Divine Mercy Sunday, which the Church marks as a universal feast day on the Second Sunday after Easter, also known as the Octave of Easter. This year, Divine Mercy Sunday falls on April 12.

Jesus told St. Faustina:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces

flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy (Diary, 699).

So set your hearts on fire with the power and presence of the Holy Spirit. Go to Confession on or before Divine Mercy Sunday; receive Holy Communion either on the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday or on Divine Mercy Sunday itself; and receive some of the most extraordinary graces God has ever promised us.



fascinating facts about Jesus' earthly life

Which language did Jesus speak? What type of food did he eat? While much is written about Jesus' miracles and revolutionary teaching, sometimes we forget the human element of Jesus' earthly life.

Jesus was born, grew up, and, as scripture succinctly explains, "Jesus wept." Jesus also spoke the language of the time and ate the foods that were common in the Middle-East. All of this reminds us that Jesus walked this earth, showing us the path to eternal life with him.

Here are some particularly fascinating facts about Jesus that give us an insight into the human side of his earthly life.

Which language did Jesus speak? We know what Jesus said during his lifetime thanks to the four gospels. But not everyone knows which language he used to communicate his message. Most historians agree in thinking that Jesus mostly spoke Aramaic, although he was also fluent in Hebrew and Greek. Aramaic was in fact the most spoken language in the Holy Land during Jesus' lifetime, which is why Mel Gibson chose it as the language for his movie The Passion of Christ.

Healthy foods that Jesus ate It's often best to remind ourselves that a simpler approach to nourishing our bodies can be

the best way. A perfect way to simplify might be following the classic Mediterranean diet Jesus himself was used to. Scriptures show Jesus' Mediterranean diet included figs, fish, lamb, wine, and olive oil.

Were Jesus and Joseph really carpenter? Most translations use the word "carpenter" to describe Jesus' and Joseph's trade. But the Greek word we read in the Gospels of Matthew and Mark can be read in many different ways. The word the Gospels use is téktōn, a common term used for artisans, craftsmen, and woodworkers (so, yes, it can translate as "carpenter"), but also, interestingly, it can refer to stonemasons, builders, construction workers, or even to those who excel in their trade and are able to teach others (as in the Italian maestro). The Latin translation we find in the Vulgate, faber, actually preserves the very different meanings the Greek téktōn has. A faber is a general term used for workers and craftsmen in general. A faber can surely work as a carpenter every now and then, but a lignarius is a carpenter by trade.

Was Jesus' name really Jesus? The name Yeshua (the original form of the Hebrew name, itself being a derivation of the earlier Yehoshua) was relatively popular in Judea in Jesus' time. One finds in the works of Flavius Josephus, the 1st-century historian, at least 20 different persons called lesous. Also, he is not the first character to be named Yeshua (Joshua) in the Bible (remember the Book of Joshua in the Old Testament?). The name, etymologically, means "God saves," "Yahweh is salvation," "Yah saves." This is indeed the name all the Gospels use to refer to Jesus.




