#### Mary's Mysteries - Perspective

I am very grateful to have been born during the second half of human history: after Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. Jesus has revealed so much to us through his teaching and witness, things that were unknown to our Old Testament predecessors.

He also gave us a mother. As 21st Century Catholics, we may take Mary for granted, but before Christ gave her to us on the Cross, his faithful did not have a heavenly mother figure to

comfort, guide, and intercede for them. They may not have recognized the omission, but if Mary was taken away from us today, it would be devastating.

Some of my best meditations come when I am praying the Rosary and contemplating Mary's Mysteries. I like to imagine how Mary might have felt at the time of these stories and how her perspective may have changed over her years of pondering. A great example is the story of Finding Jesus in the Temple. I can only imagine the fear and devastation Mary and Joseph must have felt at losing Jesus for three days, but it is interesting to note that it is chronicled as a Joyful Mystery. I am sure that during those 72 hours Mary was not running around thinking, "Someday this will be a joyful mystery!"

I have taken that message into my own heart. When I am going through a difficult time, I try to reserve judgment on whether it will be remembered as a joyful or sorrowful experience. God not only can take painful experiences and transform them into joyful ones, but sometimes the growth and wisdom we desire can only be cultivated through adversity.

Mary shows us that following the way of her Son teaches us to be open to different perspectives.

**Scripture**: Read Luke 2:41-51. How do you feel in Mary's place?

**Call to Action**: Prayerfully consider a sorrowful experience from the past and meditate on if any joy grew out of it.

Dear Friends,

Sometimes you need someone from outside to show you what's going on right in front of you every day. In the last few months, people attending Mass have been introducing themselves to me and they are from other towns – Danbury, Putnam Valley, Yonkers... or from other Christian denominations. They have been asking to join our parish because they find it so vibrant and so welcoming. They cite the hospitality (donuts and coffee anyone?), the programs for kids (All Stars and Family Program), the Adult Faith Formation, the Perpetual Adoration, the availability of Confession, the ministries to the poor and homeless. And of course, there is the beautifully renovated Church and Parish Center as well, but first they notice a spirit, the people and the place.

It makes me proud of the great staff and volunteers in all the ministries that make it all work. They have all embraced a vision for the parish that doesn't just "exist" and maintain itself but is always looking outward, like a missionary group of disciples who know Jesus and want everyone else to know how life-changing a personal relationship with him can be. We're not here to just "hang in there" in tough times, but to lead people to Jesus and let him transform their lives.

We're doing this together as two parishes whose histories are intertwined since 1934 when St. Lawrence sponsored a chapel of the Sacred Heart in Putnam Lake. We'll celebrate that history together at an **Outdoor Mass June 13** on the site of the original chapel, and we'll bless the new commemorative monuments for the chapel and its donors, as well as a the newly constructed outdoor Stations of the Cross. Join us for that Mass and a barbecue afterwards.

But first we have to do our own spiritual renewal and keep ourselves close to the Lord and his Holy Spirit. To prepare for Pentecost (May 23 this year), we'll host the Holy Spirit Retreat Saturday, May 15 given by our sister parish pastor Fr. Joe Espaillat, who leads the retreat team from the Catholic Charismatic Center of the Bronx. We'll run parallel retreats in English and in Spanish. Furthermore, families learned how to pray together while using Scripture, and visiting the Blessed Sacrament in the chapel or through the LIVE feed.



## sharing the good news

The course SHARING THE GOOD NEWS was a surprising treasure for me. Sometimes I take for granted the traditions that have been handed down from the Apostles. Before there was a Bible, there was oral tradition.

SHARING THE GOOD NEWS reinforced to my 21 classmates and me, who were in person and on Zoom, the

fact that we are all called to spread the Good News. That's the last command given by Jesus (Mk 16:15). Paul says in Romans 10:14, "How are men to call upon him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without a preacher?"

Most important, I learned how I can help spread the Good News in very practical ways. I can be the voice to reach out to those who have not heard or listened carefully. I learned skills on how to help others come to know the love of Jesus and turn to him. The power of prayer was reinforced.

As I put what I learned into practice, I had some failures and mini successes. The most impactful experience was when a woman I barely knew mentioned how ill she'd been, I asked if she would allow me to pray with her. She allowed me to do so. The beautiful surprise was that she wanted to return the favor and pray for me. Not only did I realized she needed me, I needed her.

The other interesting thing that happened was seeing how others in the class became more open to evangelize. I saw how they were positively impacted by their efforts and saw glimpses of how the Holy Spirit was working within them and the people to whom they reached out.

SHARING THE GOOD NEWS was instrumental in giving me the tools necessary to become more of an intentional disciple. Evangelization is still a work in progress for me, however, I'm looking forward to bringing more people into a relationship with Jesus.


