Dear Friends,

We all love the Fourth of July for baseball and barbecues. But more than anything, it gives us a reminder of the people who made our country great. It's been 245 years since the Declaration of Independence established the United States of America, and the war those early Americans would wage to secure our independence would go on for several more years until the British finally surrendered.



Americans have always believed, and rightly, I think, that God had a providential plan for this nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal, with rights that come from God and not from governments. The purpose of government is to secure our God-given rights.

One of those most foundational rights is the right to religious liberty. That touches on what is most sacred to the human person – his relationship to God and the voice of his conscience that tells him that he must worship and obey God above all.

It was a radical new idea in the 1700s and never perfectly put into practice, but America has always shown itself capable of progress in correcting its flaws. Abraham Lincoln in 1862 called America "the last best hope for earth."

Catholics were few among the founding Fathers, but thanks to our French allies, made up a significant portion of the soldiers who fought in the war. The Irish and Italians and Poles would immigrate later, attracted by the promise of religious freedom and opportunity in a New World.

Ninety-five years after the signing of the Declaration, in 1871 – 150 years ago - a Catholic Church for Brewster and Patterson was established on our current site and sacred worship began for the scattered Catholics among the couple thousand farmers and miners and railroad workers who settled the area.

Just as those early colonists left us a vision for "a shining city on a hill", those early Catholics in Brewster and Patterson laid the foundations for our parishes today. We build on their legacy and pass on our Catholic faith to the next generations.

They gave us our churches and our precious faith. We honor them this year and make sure we safeguard the faith and live it out with fidelity and gratitude for a nation that protects religious liberty and a Faith that reveals the living God to us all.

the life of st. lawrence

The biography of Saint Lawrence is an amazing story. It is important to share more of whom our patron Saint was. Lorcan Ua Tuathail translates in English as Lawrence O'Toole and in French as Laurent d'Eu. He was one of four sons of King Muirchertach Ua Tuathail. At the time of his son's birth, King Muirchertach was subordinate to King Diarmait. At age 10, Lawrence was sent to King Diarmait as a hostage for nearly 2 years where he lived in extreme austerity and barely given enough to eat.

One of the results of his confinement was the strengthening of Lawrence's wish to enter religious life. At 26, Lawrence rose to become Abbot of Glendalough. Lawrence, a religious reformer, wished the Irish church would reflect the Catholic Church and strengthen the bonds between Irish Church and Rome.

During Lawrence's first four months of administration, a great famine raged and pillaging beset his community. Lawrence protected his community through solemn prayer and fasting. During his reign as Abbot of Glendalough, several incidents occurred. One involved a local brigand of noble lineage that murdered laymen, despoiled clerics, and defiled women without fear of retribution. Lawrence with great sorrow, ascended to the house of God. He prayed and fasted, petitioning God to liberate his people. Shortly thereafter, the brigand was captured and died. A second incident involved three great princes of thieves whose followers whipped and killed priests and laity carrying consecrated Eucharistic hosts and in further blasphemy, took the hosts and impiously ground them with their teeth. Lawrence grieved, turned to the Lord in prayer and fasted. Within 8 days, the brigands were captured and hung. Lawrence did not ask for vengeance. He prayed for liberation of his people. Lawrence prayed, "Yours is vengeance, Lord; you better, know the time and the way of retribution." At 32, he became Archbishop of Dublin and began a policy of church building and laid the foundation stone for the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity (now Christ Church).

Lawrence was well respected by the Glendalough community and its secular neighbors for sanctity and charity to the poor. He was one of only four Irish Saints to have been formally canonized by the Catholic Church.

Lawrence was a man of faith, strength, and integrity. As I read his story, I thought of our parish. I thought of the strength of our parishioners and the leadership of our priests and deacons. I thought of all we have endured and all we do. Lawrence fed the poor of the city in his home and established care centers for abandoned children. Our parish has cared for the poor, but now it is a primary focus. We created Brewster Cares, an amazing organization of volunteers that take care of adults and children in need. Lawrence experienced famine and rose to the occasion by fighting to protect his community. He never wavered. While COVID and famine are not interchangeable, Fr. Rich and our parishes, rose to the occasion. We protected our community, continuing to provide the Eucharist, even if spiritually. Lawrence turned to prayer constantly and consistently. Our parish has Adoration 24/7. Prayer is a part of our lives, as it was his.

I believe God's plan for our parish began well before it was dedicated. Saint Lawrence, Fr. McKenna, the Gilroys, past parishioners and priests, and each one of us is a part of that plan. We are branches on a beautiful parish family tree that has grown magnificently over the last I50 years, each of us contributing to its growth and its mission.

Amazing Parish - The Real World

Amazing Parish is a movement dedicated to turning parishes into missionary communities. Fr. John Ricardo was the Keynote Speaker, and we received an excerpt from one of his books*. I was blown away by his description of the Catholic

Church. It's essential to meditate on his words and allow the truth to comfort and inspire us during this time of cultural upheaval and religious persecution.

His article begins by citing the histories of some famous civilizations that have come and gone and addresses the mistaken attitude that the Church's time might also have passed. He writes:

"Such a view might be accurate if the Church were like other human institutions. But the Church is not like other human institutions; it is a divine body, rooted in eternity, whose life is regulated by a rhythm that is not restricted by time or place."

"If we could see the Church as it really is, if our view could be opened upon what the angels see, we would be presented with a very different picture. We would see a vast company beyond the reach of death, pulsating with divine brightness, basking in the beauty and light of God, powerful in spiritual weaponry, centered on the figure of their divine and beloved King, drenched in joy and eager for the continued gathering-in of the renewed human race. We would see an ever-growing body, as each generation on earth passed through the veil, from the land of shadows to the real world, and those who had been found faithful to the rightful king shook off the last traces of their mortality and were welcomed home."

"One sometimes hears the question asked, whether or not the Church will survive. When the true nature of things is seen, the question becomes comical. Not only will the Church survive... but the Church is the only part of humanity that will survive. The only question facing those still living on earth is whether they will be joined to that bright race of divinized humans or insist on clinging to a dying and enslaved remnant of humanity that has no future but the shadows."
