
while we're at it

Dear Friends,

I'm really excited about our celebrations of 150 years of the Catholic Faith in Brewster Village, dating back to our first small wooden church in 1871! It was just after the Civil War and Brewster was just starting to get on the map, thanks to the vision of Walter Brewster and the arrival of the railroad. There were no cars, no highway system, no planes, no television or radio... and certainly no internet communications. Life was slow and communities were tightly knit and people depended on each other.

Our original 100 seat church had three Masses on Sundays, but those pioneer Catholics knew they needed to grow the Church. By 1914 a much bigger church was built, and by the early 1930's we would form a second church in Putnam Lake for the growing population there. They started a school and religious education and a series of parish organizations to serve the changing needs of a changing Church over the decades. The dream of our forefathers in the faith would come true, and today, as a parish we are "Better than Ever" before.



We'll celebrate that great history at our **Golf Outing on September 10** by raising money for our local homeless shelter. We'll celebrate at our **150th Anniversary Gala on October 16** too. And we'll **welcome Cardinal Dolan on Oct. 24** as he comes to rededicate us to build up our Church. And our **Heritage Weekend November 13-14** will put the touchstone on it all.

In the meantime, our job is to continue to build up our community of faith, and we'll be launching the wonderful **Alpha** program to invite people back to a relationship with Jesus. We're developing dozens of "small discipleship groups" for people to keep growing in their faith and find support from each other.

We're welcoming new Catholics through our **RCIA** program and we're inviting everyone to get involved in our **Brewster Cares** efforts that feed and house the poor in our area, teach English and provide for kids through our camps and Vacation Bible School.

One reminder – our **religious education programs** of Family Program and Edge will be joined together between Sacred Heart and St. Lawrence this year – take a moment on the website to get your kids registered.

- The retail value of what we sold was around \$9,300



the greek revival in brewster

When the American Revolution ended, the Commissioners of Forfeiture sold to Peleg Bailey a large farm that included much of the land that was to become the Village of Brewster. His farmhouse was east of the intersection of Oak Street and Prospect Street. A portion of Peleg's farm was passed to his grandson Bailey Howes. In 1833, Howes sold 98 acres to Gilbert Bailey who acquired another 39 acres. Gilbert Bailey's farmhouse was at the foot of the present driveway to the Garden Street School. On February I7, 1848, 134 acres were sold to James and Walter Brewster for \$8,000.00. The Brewster brothers were descendants of Elder Brewster who arrived on the Mayflower! Their farm had a source of power in a stream that flowed north and emptied into the Croton River and beneath the surface of of their farm was a considerable amount of rich iron deposits. They decided this was an ideal spot to start a new village. It

had the power for factories and transportation for raw materials, finished products, and workers were available. James was gifted mechanically, and Walter was an architect and builder.

In 1849 the railroad was completed as far as Brewster. James reopened the iron mine, located on the north side of Main Street. It was

here James invented Walter Brewster House on Oak Street

and manufactured the gimlet point screw. After removing 300 tons of ore, James sold the mineral rights to Harvey Steel and

Iron Company for \$4,000.00. James invented the hulling rice machine and moved south to introduce and manufacture his invention. Walter stayed and followed his dream to develop Brewster. He built two railroad depots and built Main Street from the depots to the existing road at the end of Oak Street, allowing stagecoaches to connect with the trains at the Brewster depot. Walter Brewster is said to be responsible for 50 structures in Brewster including churches and public dwellings. One of his best-known houses in the Greek revival is a mansion on the hill between Oak Street and Main Street, referred to at one time as the Walter Brewster House. One of my fondest memories of this house is being able to sit on its spacious front lawn with multiple other families during the '60s and watch the Brewster Fire Department parade!

The Village of Brewster was incorporated in 1894. Once a farm area, Brewster quickly became a thriving village with factories and mills along the river, iron mines, houses, shops, a railroad, a newspaper, banks, two schools, and

five religious groups, including St. Lawrence O'Toole!

As I pass the former Walter Brewster house and the homes along Main Street, I imagine Brewster 150 years ago and how it all began. Walter Brewster impacted the lives of millions. I am grateful to him. his brother. and countless others for their generosity and community effort



who gave their heart to our village where St. Lawrence calls home.

"Every day offers a choice: what sort of reading, what sort of TV, what sort of conversation, what sort of friends will we choose to welcome into our homes." I read this quote in the Magnificat recently. It is an awakening to think of our choices

in entertainment as being welcomed into our home. Consider some of the disturbing stories and characters in books, movies, and the news. Then ask yourself: do I want to invite them into my mind, my home, my life?

Several years ago, people were raving about the Netflix series, **Breaking Bad**, so I started watching it. I found it very disturbing


but held on for a couple of episodes until I realized it was making me feel very yucky inside. I believe it was God telling me that it wasn't good for me. I have been very conscious since then to stay away from entertainment content that glorifies or normalizes evil in our society. We can include social media in that mix as well. Facebook, Instagram, Pinterest, etc. all have their good sides, but we have to be careful when we invite them into our home.

On August 20, from 7:00 pm-9:30 pm in the St. Lawrence Gym, we will be showing the documentary *The Social Dilemma*. In it, former executives from big tech firms like Google, Facebook, and Instagram sound the alarm on the dangerous influence social media has on our society. We will also watch a video by Bishop Barron challenging Catholics to reject the mean-spirited indignity and violation of charity and justice that is rampant on those platforms today.

Proverbs 2:10-13 tells us, "Wisdom will enter your heart. Discretion will watch over you, saving you from the way of evil men, from men of perverse speech, who leave the straight paths to walk in ways of darkness." We must be educated and vigilant to protect our homes. Wisdom and discretion will protect us from evil.
