

We had hundreds of kids, families, parishioners, and visitors come along to see the exhibits of the history of Brewster and our parish. They all enjoyed good fun while thanking God for the great things he has done here at St. Lawrence during this century and a half, since the Catholic faith first arrived to Brewster, New York.

Inside this bulletin, we capture some of the special moments as people learned the history of our parish, and the local and world situation at the time we were founded. We've got a great history, but we keep making it better... **Better than Ever**. We don't just look backward with nostalgia for the "good ole' days", but we press ahead to make the Church bigger, holier, and more present in our society than ever.



So our celebration of our history is far from over. We have some great events coming up:

He's bringing hundreds of relics of the saints with him and will explain how veneration of these relics connects us to the history of the Church and especially the great saints of the past who proved to us holiness is the calling of all and is possible to achieve today.

Saturday, **January 15**, **at 5:30 pm. Cardinal Timothy Dolan** will round out our celebration of the 150th Anniversary with a celebration of Mass and a reception afterward in the gym. Join us to meet our Shepherd in person and hear his encouragement to be **Better than Ever**.

I'm proud to be pastor of two great parishes and grateful for the wonderful staff and volunteers who have made our celebrations of our heritage so powerful and so much fun.

a nod to our ancestors

Our first wooden church was dedicated in 1871. On Heritage Weekend, St. Lawrence captured this era for two days. We were given the wonderful opportunity of experiencing life as our early parishioners once did. Our parish gym was transformed into several learning centers; each depicting an event from years ago.



There was a replica of an altar with Latin prayers. The Latin Mass, also known as the Tridentine Mass, established by Pope Pius V in 1570, featured a highly formal ritual where the priest faces the altar rather than the congregation. In 1963, the Second Vatican Council modernized the Roman Catholic liturgy and allowed more participation and understanding of the Mass by the congregation. Newspaper articles of Brewster from the 1800s

were displayed on a large banner. Another banner outlined the history of the Catholic Church. A video portrayed pictures of Brewster and St. Lawrence during the last I50 years. Visitors tried homemade stew and brown bread, and timely snacks including popcorn, pretzels, and ice cream.

An enclosed tent was set up to replicate the Tilly Foster Mine. Plaster trays were distributed with hammers and mining hats. Kids and adults alike realized how difficult mining was in the l800s. An alpaca, goat, sheep, pig, ducks, chickens, ferrets, a turtle, and guinea pigs were a big hit at the petting zoo. Maureen Herbstritt and Carrie O'Donnell brought their chickens and ducks for the children to pet and taught them how different chicken and duck eggs were. In one comer of the gym, decked out with corn stalks and hay bales, children learned how to plant seeds. They also played games from the l800s. Lynn Lamont of Brewster Library read nature stories and led the children in the Turkey Trot and Hokey Pokey. The parish staff, including Fr. Gill, and several parishioners dressed in the attire of the l800s.

A scavenger hunt had families seeking out symbols and statues all around St. Lawrence's campus. Children and adults were given miniature chalkboards to try their hand at the cursive alphabet, from the past. A handmade quilt laid across the back of a rocking chair and nearby a basket was filled with knitting needles and a wooden spindel used to turn raw wool into yarn. There was even a Bible from the l800s. Amy Campanaro of Southeast Museum gave a presentation on the history of Brewster as she shared photos from the l800s - Tilly Foster Mine, Borden Milk Factory, Main Street, Brewster Railroad Station, the first firehouse, Southeast House, Morningthorpe, Stonehenge and more! Ken Clare and Fireman Bill of Brewster Fire Department spoke on fire safety and demonstrated fire equipment from the l9th and 21st century. We discovered how beehives work and evolved from the 1800s and the health benefits of honey from beekeeper Janet Ward. In our stone church,

The Putnam Chorale performed wonderful melodies such as Beautiful Dreamer, Home Sweet Home, Down in the River to Pray and Eternal Father (Hymn of the Navy) from the 1800s.



After two days of learning, experiencing our past, touring the church, Parish Center, and museum, we gathered together for a traditional pig roast. Fr. Tom Berg said it best at his homily Saturday evening —"We stand on the shoulders of generations before us who went through challenging times. Jesus remained always with us. It is actually remarkable that we have a church where we have worshipped God for I50 years." It was a beautiful tribute to our early parishioners, our community, and our faith. Kudos to all who put together an embracing and fun Heritage Weekend. We truly are blessed. God Bless St. Lawrence and Sacred Heart on your I50th Anniversary!

QUALITY WORKMANSHIP



Last week, I read St. Paul's words to the Corinthians, "Brothers and sisters: you are God's building. ...like a wise master builder I laid a foundation and another is building upon it. But each one must be careful how he builds upon it, for no one can lay a foundation other than the one that

is there, namely, Jesus Christ."In my last article, I wrote about my friend's estranged uncles praying for her and her siblings and I saw a connection with this reading.

If we envision each of our individual families as a building, looking back to our grandparents as the foundation, some of us will claim that our footing is solid. That our grandparents were faithful Chris-

tians who taught their children to love, honor, and obey Jesus. Many of those will continue on to explain that their parents used the tools and training handed down to them to stack the next generation squarely on top of the first. Some of us are still following the carefully executed family blueprint today and handing it over to our children, so that our building remains level and square as it grows taller.

Others of us might admit that there has been some poor workmanship in their structure over the last two generations. St. Paul teaches that Jesus Christ must be our foundation, so if we see that our building is a bit cock-eyed, it most probably means that one or more of our key family members didn't build upon Jesus' bedrock.

But our hope lives in the fact that a master builder can always recognize good architecture and restabilize a structure to be comparable to the best. As disciples, we can throw ourselves into renovating our families too. It is never too late. Learning, praying, talking openly about, and modeling our faith can reveal the flaws that are compromising our family's spiritual integrity. As we lay our own stones, let us make the necessary adjustments so that the next generation appreciates quality workmanship and can build expertly and squarely upon Christ.

Scripture: Read 1 Corinthians 3:9-15. What stands out?
