



In the early 1900s newspaper articles at Christmas time, like today, contained articles focused on the most wonderful time of the year. I read of beautiful window displays on Main Street, children visiting Santa, church services, and advertisements. "For Her Merriest Christmas – the World's Champion Car!"The ad was for a Studebaker Commander at \$1,400! There were ads for simpler gifts, such as handkerchiefs beginning at 5 cents!

In 1922, Christmas midnight Mass at St. Lawrence was carried out with full ceremonials. Eight hundred people attended. The usual *Missa Cantata* was sung by Fr. Phelan, the choir sang *Adeste Fideles*, *Silent Night*, and other favorites. The article gave full detail of how beautiful our church was decorated and the joy that emanated.

A newspaper article written in 1906 by Rev. Walter J. Yates, caught my eye.

"There was no place for them in the inn. It was a strange thing for the Lord of all worlds to make his bed in a manger. The wise men from the east sought Him in the place which seems most natural – in the palace of the king. But He was not there. There was nothing in that palace or the persons living there which was like Him. He was Prince of Peace, but peace never found a lodging place where Herod lived, and so Christ would find no home where such a king abode. He came to earth to save the poor in heart and bring victory to the lowliest of the human race. Why, then, should He find lodging anywhere other than among the lowly? Here was safety also. If born in the palace, He might have suffered the fate of some of the best of the king's sons, the very fate which Herod tried to inflict on Jesus when

he ordered the slaughter of the babes of Bethlehem. He is safer far in the manger bed than in the king's arms.

"There is also a sign to us at the present time. To find the things of Christ, you must seek them not so much among the high and mighty of the world as among the lowly and meek. There are births for which the nations wait in eager expectancy, and which are heralded by roar of cannon and bonfires and celebrated by carousal and delirious joy. There are pomp and ceremony. But not in this case. He owns all. He made all. He comes to call all, but His kingdom is not like these others. Earth's wealth shall be poured out for Him as never for any other. He shall dwell among men as men never before saw monarch live. He shall claim and receive homage such as no other one ever did or shall receive. He shall come into His own and shall reign supreme, but not as the Herods and Caesars. The manger is His sign."

I often wondered why our King was born in the cold, among farm animals. I have since come to understand the significance of his birth. Jesus stepped down from heaven's riches to live among the poorest of the poor. Today, I look at the manger and think of humility. Jesus is a gift to everyone. As a result, we have become the richest of all people. He humbled himself – he was laid down where animals eat – and so it all began, the miracle that would be our salvation and our eternity in glory.

This Christmas Season, as I look forward to Jesus' birth, I will look upon the manger with a renewed awareness of that cold night over 2,000 years ago when there was no room in the inn, and our Savior was laid in a manger in a stable in the little town of Bethlehem.

On Wednesday, December I6, parishioners from St. Lawrence and Sacred Heart took a road trip to St. Edward's the Confessor in New Fairfield, CT. Chris Stefanick is an internationally acclaimed author, speaker, and television host who has devoted his life to inspiring people to live a bold, contagious faith. He authored the book *Living Joy – Nine Rules to Help you Rediscover and Live Joy Every Day*. Many of us were familiar with his book. We read it. Several months ago, we participated in his course offered at St. Lawrence beautifully spearheaded by Jo-Ann Adorno and Eric Ursprung. Now we were blessed to see Chris Stefanick in person.

Chris was embracing, energetic, funny, and real. He expressed the ways we can lose Joy only to find it again and keep it.

Jesus promised, "No one will take your joy from you" (John 16:22), because as Chris reminds us, "the world can't take what it didn't give you." Chris explains how an anchor is a symbol of hope. The choppy surface of the sea does not disturb an anchor. Hurricanes and tidal waves and persecutions and job loss and cancer cannot rob you of your hope when it is anchored in the Love that is God. "Joy isn't what happens when life goes perfectly. It is what happens when you know you are loved perfectly."

After he spoke, Chris took the time to talk to us. It was a great night spent with good friends and Chris Stefanick who reminded us Joy is not a fleeting moment, it is found when you "Set your mind on things that are above and not on earth." Colossians 3:2.

in our society. I attended for two hours that night, then returned to continue my vigil in the morning.




