Dear Friends,

Pope Francis is known for being a different kind of pope – a bit unpredictable and very much an original thinker. One of the ideas he has proposed to the Church is using “synods”, that is gatherings of bishops and others, to discuss issues of importance to the Church and her efforts to evangelize the world. He has even said we should have a “synodal Church” where this becomes a regular feature of the way the Catholic Church would operate. He doesn’t want a situation where bishops in Rome are in a bubble, listening only to each other, and out of touch with the reality of the lay faithful around the world.

So he has proposed a **Synod for 2023** but first, he wants to make sure it is properly prepared in local dioceses around the world. He wants bishops to conduct listening sessions with their priests and people first and hear out what people say.

This isn’t about changing doctrine. What we believe is what is contained in Jesus’s revelation and handed down by the teaching authority of the Church, which is always guided by the Holy Spirit. That’s not up to us to change or modify. This effort by Pope Francis concerns how the Church can find ways to communicate more effectively, to listen more compassionately, to serve more lovingly.

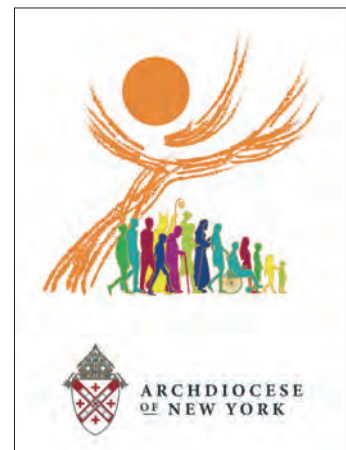
It’s a great idea, born of the conviction that what Jesus teaches is from the Lord and it is the Truth, the truth that sets us free. But often our efforts to teach that truth are undermined by the way we go about it, how we speak and act, and the limitations we have as human beings in a complicated world. He wants us to understand the world around us much better, so we can adapt our approach more effectively and have a greater impact.

Cardinal Dolan is organizing “listening sessions” all around our Archdiocese to gather up the insights and wisdom of our people. Input will be forwarded to the US Bishops Conference and on to Rome. A similar process is underway in countries around the world.

Our local Synodal session is coming up: **March 26 from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm** at St. Columba Church in Hopewell Junction. Several of our parishioners have offered to serve as small group discussion leaders. Anyone is welcome to attend and give your input. I encourage you all to go – it should be a great experience! Info is in this bulletin and on the website.

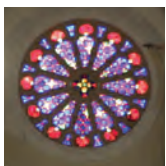

The National Order of Daughters of Isabella was founded in Utica, NY, in 1903 by John E. Carberry and several other Knights of Columbus as a charitable, benevolent, and patriotic sorority for Catholic ladies. In 1921, the Order changed its name to the **Catholic Daughters of America (CDA)**. It is dedicated to the principles of "Unity and Charity." The group was placed under the patronage of the Blessed Virgin and dedicated to the service of God and Country.

In 1908, the CDA had ninety courts and grew from a membership of less than 100 to more than 10,000. The CDA supported World War I and World War II efforts.

Here at St. Lawrence, Court Bernadine #185 was granted a charter on December 1, 1912. Fr. Phelan was the first Chaplain. The first elected Grand Regent was Nellie G. Mergardt. Early meetings were held at the former Walter Brewster House. Today meetings are held in the Parish Center. Our Court helped set in motion four other Courts: The Bishop Francis X. Ford Group of Putnam Lake, Our Lady of Lake in Carmel, Father John P. Mooney of Mahopac, and Queen of Peace in Wappingers Falls. Court Bernadine's present Grand Regent is Mary Thomson.



In 1915, when our stone church was erected, Court Bernadine donated the beautiful Rose Window in the sanctuary and St. Joseph's altar. When our parochial school was built, their donation was one of the classrooms. When our church was renovated, Court Bernadine contributed to the refurbishment of the Rose Window.

In 1952, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen addressed the delegates at the 24th Biennial Convention. "Catholic Daughters of America; I would like you to become Catholic Daughters of the World." Soon thereafter the first "world" court was instituted in Kenya, Africa. In 1954, the Order changed its name to the Catholic Daughters of the Americas.

In October 1972, Mother Teresa, founder of the Missionaries of Charity in Calcutta, spoke to an audience of Catholic Daughters in Washington, DC, to mark National Catholic Daughters Day. She asked the CDA members to continue to "give to our brothers and sisters throughout the world as if once more Jesus had come into the world cold, hungry, and alone."

In 1990, the bishops approached the organization to take a "leadership role" in support of the Papal Foundation, citing CDA's committed support of "the Church at the highest level." John Cardinal O'Connor, Archbishop of New York spoke, "The Catholic Daughters has a rich tradition of loyalty and generosity to the Church."

Court Bernadine #185 has an honorable and proud history. In addition to supporting our Parish and Religious Education, our Court supports the Sisters of Life, education, cancer patients, homeless, veterans, Little Sisters of the Poor, Food Pantry, Putnam Community Action Partnership, religious orders, elderly, and children and students in need to name a few. The Catholic Daughters make beautiful Baptismal bibs for our parish and knit/crochet items for infants, the elderly, and children in need. The Catholic Daughters are a strong advocate for the unborn.

The CDA have made a difference on the State and National Level and here at our parishes. They are one of the oldest and largest organizations of Catholic Women in America. Their service to others, love for Jesus, and their intercession with the Blessed Mother define who they are. They certainly have a special place in our parish history.



a beautiful ordination

On Tuesday, March 1, we witnessed Auxiliary Bishops John Bonnici and Joseph Espaillat ordained as Bishops at St. Patrick's Cathedral. We were guests of Fr. Espaillat, Pastor of St. Anthony of Padua, our sister parish. It was incredibly special to watch Fr. Espaillat, who means so much to our parish, be ordained a Bishop.

His Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan, who served as the Principal Ordaining Bishop and Celebrant, welcomed us. His charisma was at its best. During his Homily, he respectfully acknowledged the presence of Archbishop Gudziak and Bishop Chomnyk of the Ukrainian Catholic Church and asked for prayer.

Apostolic letters calling the Bishops-elect to the Episcopal ministry were read by His Excellency the Most Reverend Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States of America. "Our vocation is to respond to the one who loved us first. The Lord never ceases to love us or call us. He uses each of us to write the history of Salvation. We think of Peter, Paul, Matthew, just to name a few. Jesus did not choose them because they were perfect but because he was completely committed to each of them. It is imperative to remember that the people of God are hoping to find Shepherds in the style of Jesus."

During the Litany of Supplication, the Bishops-elect laid face down in the sanctuary as names of saints were sung in prayer. Following the Litany of Supplication, Cardinal Dolan laid his hands upon the Bishops-elect. All the Bishops then laid hands upon the Bishops-elect. His Eminence, with the Book of the Gospels, placed them open, above the head of each of the Bishops-elect



announcing as successors of the Apostles, they are to continue the Apostolic preaching of Jesus the Lord and Savior. With hands outstretched, Cardinal Dolan prayed the prayer of Ordination. Together with the laying on of hands, this prayer affects the Ordination of the Bishops. Followed was the Anointing of the Head and Handing on of the Book of Gospels and the Insignia. In handing them their crosier, Cardinal Dolan spoke "Receive the crosier, the sign of the pastoral office, and keep watch over the whole flock in which the Holy Spirit has just placed you Bishop to govern the Church of God."

Bishop Espaillat, who became the youngest bishop at 45 years old, shared his gratitude in his closing remarks. "We could not be here without Almighty God. Thank you, your Eminence, for trusting and believing and to my parents who I am privileged to have here today, for their love and nurturing." Bishop Espaillat's motto is "He Knows What He is About." He ended his remarks saying, "As we say in the hood: It's a new day! Let's get it!"

LISTENING TO SOULS



I love Jesus' teaching on recognizing a tree by its fruit. On the surface, we hear that fruit that is beautiful to the eye seems to come from a tree that is healthy and productive. But meditating on this analogy further reveals a deeper message.

Let's consider how we use our senses to judge fruit. Initially, we might evaluate it by its appearance. Is it beautiful to the eye, a ripe color, good shape, unblemished? Next, we would touch it and see if it is firm and ripe. Does it feel and smell juicy? Usually, this evaluation is taking place in a

market where we cannot test the fruit, so after looking and touching it, we decide to buy or walk away. The real test comes at home when we cut it up and taste it. Often, we are deceived, right? Red Delicious apples used to live up to their name when I was a kid, but I have given up buying them. I have learned that rotten things can look beautiful and may have come from a tree that looks healthy and productive, but for what purpose if the fruit is worthless?

Some people's actions are clearly rotten. They don't try very hard to do good works, and we can avoid those people effortlessly. The people we have to be extra watchful of are the ones who appear to do good works but are only deceiving others with beautiful exteriors when at its core their work is rotten and harmful. That requires discernment.

Jesus tells us that words are the fruits of the tree of the soul, and we need to use our ears to recognize good souls. Mean, blasphemous, thoughtless, shallow, ignorant words reveal mean, blasphemous, thoughtless, shallow, ignorant souls. Beautiful, honest, thoughtful, kind, loving words reveal souls with those qualities. As disciples, we must surround ourselves with beautiful souls, so that their influence will make our souls beautiful. We must choose our basket carefully. We all know what they say about "one bad apple."

Scripture: Read Luke 6:43-45. What stands out?

Call to Action: Listen to the words your friends and associates speak. Are they the words of a beautiful soul? Do they deserve to be in your basket?
