

When we got the idea to collect money for refugees in **Ukraine**, I honestly thought we'd collect \$3,000 - \$5,000 maximum and that would have been very good, more than most second collections we do here at our parishes.

But we tallied up what came in this weekend from both parishes and it was more than \$22,000!!! That is a Christmas or Easter level collection. I was amazed and overwhelmed. Thank you for your awesome generosity toward our suffering brothers and sisters. We will send that on to the Knights of Malta working on the front lines in Ukraine.

We also collected a large quantity of essential items for refugees who have made it into Poland, and we will send that over along with goods that were collected at St. Joseph's in Danbury, CT.

Thank you for the love and support of people who are fleeing for their lives, or fighting for their homeland in this war of aggression. The Holy Father has called the Russian attack "barbaric" and unjust. We Catholics have to do all we can to help those who are suffering.

Above all, we have to pray for peace. And that, not one single more innocent person be killed. May God in his infinite power turn the hearts of those who long for power and hate to peace and reconciliation instead.

why do the stations of the cross

The object of the **Stations of the Cross** is to help the faithful to make in spirit, as it were, a pilgrimage to the chief scenes of Christ's sufferings and death, and this has become one of the most popular of Catholic devotions.

It is carried out by passing from Station to Station, with certain prayers at each and devout meditation on the various incidents in turn. It is very usual, when the devotion is performed publicly, to sing a stanza of the "Stabat Mater" while passing from one Station to the next.

Inasmuch as the Way of the Cross, made in this way, constitutes a miniature pilgrimage to the holy places at Jerusalem, the origin of the devotion may be traced to the Holy Land. The Via Dolorosa at Jerusalem (though not called by that name before the sixteenth century) was reverently marked out from the earliest times and has been the goal of pious pilgrims ever since the days of Constantine.

Tradition asserts that the Blessed Virgin used to visit daily the scenes of Christ's Passion and St. Jerome speaks of the crowds of pilgrims from all countries who used to visit the holy places in his day. There is, however, no direct evidence as to the existence of any set form of the devotion at that early date, and it is noteworthy that St. Sylvia (c. 380) says nothing about it in her "Peregrinatio ad loca sancta", although she describes minutely every other religious exercise that she saw practiced there. A desire to reproduce the holy places in other lands, in order to satisfy the devotion of those who were hindered from making the actual pilgrimage, seems to have manifested itself at quite an early date.



a determined pastor meets his match

In 1943, Fr. Joseph A. Heaney became our Pastor. Prior to entering St. Joseph's Seminary, Fr. Heaney worked in the linen goods trade for ten years. He had a sharp mind for business and investments and spoke both German and Spanish. Fr. Joseph Heaney was ordained December 20, 1916. His first assignment was Incarnation Church in Manhattan. During his 27-year

assignment at Incarnation Church, he supervised the expansion of the church, school, convent, and rectory. Fr. Heaney also served as assistant to Msgr. Joseph Delaney, who was a consultant to Cardinal Joseph Hayes, Archbishop of New York.

Upon his arrival at St. Lawrence, Fr. Heaney had several challenges before him. Following the fire which destroyed Sacred Heart Church, services were moved into the Hance residence. Fr. Heaney, on behalf of Sacred Heart, bought the residence from the Hance Estate along with seven acres of Hance property. The Sacred Heart Chapel operated as a mission church of St. Lawrence. Priests from St. Lawrence presided at Masses in Putnam Lake.

The community of Putnam Lake was growing and the Sacred Heart Chapel was not sufficient to meet the needs of its growing congregation. In August 1952, a committee was formed to discuss a proposal to build a new church. They met with Fr. Heaney; always conscious of expenses, he hesitated with their request to build a new church but he had met his match. The parishioners of Sacred Heart were persistent! Fr. Heaney

advised them if they could show sufficient financial backing in the amount of at least \$20,000, he would approach the Chancery Office. On March 17, 1953, a building fund social was held at the Putnam Lake Inn which was highly successful. To his surprise, the sum of \$20,000 was placed before him. He admired their dedication and embraced their faithfulness. A new church for Sacred Heart was approved! Fr. Heaney oversaw its construction which commenced in the Spring of 1954. By May 1954, a 90 'x 40' shell was completed. Plumbing and heating installed. By summer, the structure was completed.

On July 7, 1957, Sacred Heart was designated a full parish by the New York Archdiocese. Cardinal Spellman installed Fr. Gerald Cahill as their Pastor and named Fr. Heaney of St Lawrence, a Monsignor! What an honor!

On June 29, 1958, Francis Cardinal Spellman presided over the dedication ceremonies of Sacred Heart. He blessed the exterior and interior of the church and a solemn high Mass followed. Over 1,000 people were in attendance. A public address system was installed for those people who stood outside the church. Msgr. Terence Cooke assistant to Cardinal Spellman was present. The sermon was delivered by Rev. Joseph P. Moore, pastor of the Catholic Chapel at the West Point Military Academy. Banners, flags, and signs decorated Haviland Drive to greet the Cardinal! Cardinal Spellman expressed his gratitude to the "warm welcome received from the Putnam Lake Community." Local police officers managed traffic and the large crowd. The color guard of the Putnam Lake VFW Post 9267 greeted the Cardinal as did Putnam County Sheriff Frank Lyden and Patterson Supervisor Emil Buechel.

What a day for the parishioners of Sacred Heart! How proud they had to be as their church, which they longed for, was dedicated. Sacred Heart, was rebuilt through the determination of its faithful parishioners led by Fr. Heaney.

In a little over a week, St. Lawrence and Sacred Heart rallied a team of volunteers to collect, sort, and pack purses, backpacks, duffel and diaper bags filled with essential items for Ukrainian refugees in Poland. As always, our parishioners filled our gym with their generosity. Some even ran back out to the stores to buy more things after their first drop-off. It empowered them to find a way to help people who are experiencing such dire suffering.

People in the community joined us too. A Brewster Social Studies teacher collected items in her class and some of her students came to volunteer. Anne Koplik even donated necklaces to add into women's purses. How happy those women will be to receive something that makes them feel pretty. Beauty is essential too!

Ultimately we collected over 31 large shipping boxes for women and babies, men and children. We should be proud of this response, but bringing our community together to serve people we will never meet may produce more good than the essential items collected. Spiritually we are uniting our minds, hearts, and prayers with Ukrainian people. That may be a gift we cannot see or touch, but in God's Kingdom may be more beneficial than shampoo and warm socks!

LISTEN



Last Saturday, I participated in our region's Synod listening session at St. Columba's School in Hopewell Junction. As Father Gill had announced, Pope Francis has instructed all of the bishops of the world to bring the faithful together to listen: to listen to the Holy Spirit and to each other.

It began with a Scripture reading from Luke 2:46-51: Mary and Joseph find 12-year-old Jesus in the temple. The meditation they provided was very beautiful, and I want to share part of it with you:


Luke's first description of the boy Jesus in the temple is that he was listening. Before astounding the temple teachers with his understanding, Jesus was listening to them. Perhaps Jesus' profound human understanding was the fruit of his profound listening: when the boy Jesus returned with Mary and Joseph to Nazareth, he was obedient to them. He listened to them.

One aspect of the unity that binds Jesus' disciples is that each one has experienced being heard by Jesus, being important to Jesus, being taken seriously by Jesus. Jesus wouldn't spend so much time with so many sinners if they were not important to him. He would not have corrected Pharisees, temple merchants, and even Peter and the apostles with such urgency, if their well-being and salvation were not of the utmost importance.

Jesus listened to the temple elders, his parents, his followers, and his adversaries. Even if he didn't agree, he showed them respect by listening first. All or most of his famous teachings stem from a question posed to Him. Equally important, the Gospels teach us that He listened to the Holy Spirit.

If our all-knowing God's primary communication strategy is to listen first, we need to do the same. Quiet our minds and our mouths. Listen to the needs, and concerns of one another, listen to the Holy Spirit, then respond in charity and love.

Scripture: Read Luke 2:46-51. What stands out? **Call to Action:** Strive to achieve profound human understanding by developing profound listening skills.
