Today we enter the most solemn week of the Christian year – **Holy Week**. It's the time we commemorate and relive the deepest mysteries that matter to us: our redemption by Jesus through his suffering, death, and resurrection. All you'll lose is your sin and guilt, and you'll find a new, richer friendship with Jesus waiting for you.



Tucked within the history of our parish, is St. Bernard's Church in Towners, NY. It was a mission church of St. Joseph's Church in Croton Falls. When St. Lawrence Church became a permanent parish in 1877, the Towners parish became its mission church. The mission church was transferred to Sacred Heart Church in 1957, when Sacred Heart became a permanent parish.

In February 1875, the construction for St. Bernard's began. In July 1875, David Haines, Commissioner for the Town of Patterson, and a well-known and generous farm owner, hosted a fundraising picnic for St. Bernard's. In August 1875, with his fundraising efforts and those of many, the church was completed. On September 26, 1875, St. Bernard's was dedicated. Vicar General Quinn of New York performed the dedicatory services assisted by Rev. Patrick J. Healy, who became St. Bernard's first pastor. When Fr. Healy became our pastor in 1877, St. Bernard's became part of his jurisdiction.

The church was beautiful. It was wood and measured 58'x 35'. The main altar was flanked by a side altar displaying a statute of the Blessed Mother. On the front and rear walls were stained glass windows and the side walls held tinted windows to allow in the natural light. The construction of the church cost \$4,500. At completion, the amount of \$2,700 remained unpaid. History reveals one Mother M. Alphonsa Lathrop loaned money for the church's construction. She was the daughter of Nathaniel Hawthorne. She founded Rosary Hill Home in Hawthorne, NY, and became a Servant of Relief for Incurable Cancer. Rosary Hill is well known in ministering to people with terminal cancer. Its

mission statement is "We cannot cure our patients, but we can assure the dignity and value of their final days."

In 1924, before our pastor, Fr. Phelan was transferred, the debt was paid off to Mother Lathrop.

The Catholic population continued to grow in the Hudson Valley. In 1956 four Sunday Masses were held at St. Lawrence, three at Sacred Heart and one at St. Bernard's.

In 1957, St. Bernard's was not properly maintained due to disuse, and it began to deteriorate. St. Bernard's last Mass was held in the summer of 1962.

In July 1970, Rev. James T. Breen, pastor of the Sacred Heart Church appealed for assistance from parishioners in Patterson to renovate St. Bernard's. At that time Sacred Heart Church was renting quarters in Christ Episcopal Church in Patterson to meet the needs of its growing parish. Despite the appeal and the good intentions of parishioners, St. Bernard's church closed and was sold to a private owner.

Last weekend I traveled to Towners to see the once active parish church and what it had become. On a narrow road, on a small mountainside, sits what was once St. Bernard's Church. It is now a home pictured above. As one can see from the recent picture, the stained glass windows remain, and skylights have been added. The two doors that welcomed parishioners back in the day when it was a church, remain. I could easily visualize parishioners going in and out of those front doors and the activity of the parish. Beautiful then, and beautiful now, it is comforting to know that a church once loved and embraced by parishioners of that era, is loved today by those who call it their home.



there is a heaven!

Our God is real, He is love, He forgives and our faith needs to be nourished. If you weren't able to attend Fr. Jeff Couture's talk on April 2, it's my hope that this short article will encourage you to view the video on **stlawrenceotoolelive.org**. Fr. Jeff began with some background on his early life, outside influences and his rebellion that ultimately led to drug and alcohol use, a total rejection of God, joining a metal band, dropping out of school in the 9th grade and leaving home at age 18. Father impressed upon parents and young people his conviction (through his near-death experience) that friends and music are two of the biggest influencers of young people.

When an overdose took his life at age 19, he found himself standing alone in purgatory. He immediately understood that there is a God and that everything his parents and the Church had tried to teach him was true. He could see and feel the extreme goodness and love of heaven ahead of him and sense the darkness and despair of hell behind him. He instantly knew that he had not lived a life that allowed him to enter heaven. His Guardian Angel revealed himself and took him back to earth to watch his life played out. He saw all the sins he had not confessed and intimately felt how they had damaged his soul and harmed the people around him. Returning to purgatory, he was told he was going to hell but as soon as he began to feel sorry for his sins, Jesus appeared. He told us that Jesus looked like the Divine Mercy image of him with the red and blue rays streaming from his heart. Jesus forgave him and told him to "Do unto others as I have done unto you." With that, his Guardian Angel pushed him back into his body

and he was given a second chance. It has taken years for him to process what had happened and continues to confer with his spiritual advisor, believing that more will be revealed to him through spiritual exercises.

Fr. Jeff also stressed the importance of intercessory prayer for one another and the souls in purgatory, because he ultimately learned that it was his father's daily rosary for him that produced the graces he needed for Jesus to grant him a second chance. He explained that purgatory is not a punishment; rather, it is an opportunity for reparation of our souls so that we are prepared to enter heaven.

Fr. Jeff's transformation since that life-changing experience has been gradual, but his immediate reaction included a return to

church and most importantly to the Sacrament of Confession. We were reminded of God's mercy and how important it is that we ask for it. Father explained that the sins we confess in the confessional are forgiven, but we will be held accountable for those that we do not confess. A sincere confession is the best way for each of us to prepare now for our unknown day of judgment.

ROUSING INSIGHT



Back in high school, I thought my English teachers were full of baloney. When we analyzed literature, they taught us that everything the author includes is purposeful: colors, scents, time of day, word repetition, sentence length, on and on. I believed they were giving the writers far too much credit and teachers just got a kick out of making the stuff up. In

the decades since, I have grown to appreciate those lessons. I especially find it relevant in reading Scripture. If we consider that human authors can skillfully craft their stories with words that maximize their meaning and relevance, imagine how effective the Holy Spirit can be.

When we begin studying Scripture, we are taught that the Old Testament prophesizes the New Testament and the New Testament fulfills the Old. One of the proofs that Jesus really is God is that the Old Testament prophets wrote of Him centuries before He was born.


This weekend's First Reading from Isaiah is a perfect example. He wrote: "The Lord has given me a well-trained tongue, that I might know how to speak to the weary a word that will rouse them." 800 years later, Jesus' "well-trained tongue" was effective during his earthly ministry and continues to be both arousing and comforting today through the Gospels.


Isaiah prophesied the dark days the future Messiah would endure too. "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who pluck my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting." It is fascinating to see Jesus' Passion documented centuries before his torturers were conceived.

Reading Scripture is one of the most effective ways to get to know Jesus. Drawing on our English lessons helps too. What is the significance of each line? Why might the author have used that word? Is there another similar story elsewhere? Reading in this way is prayerful. We not only learn our story, but we give the Spirit permission to draw us into it.

Scripture: Read Isaiah 50:4-7. What stands out?

Call to Action: Join Walking to Eternity, beginning April 19th and learn prayerful meditation with Scripture.
