Dear Friends,

We can expect there will be a lot of continuing controversy about abortion in the years to come now that the Supreme Court has ruled that there is no constitutional right to abortion. That gives us as Christians a chance to influence legislation and even more importantly, replace the abortion on demand culture with a culture of life.

Our Catholic Church has always been a leader in this regard, working to protect every human life from the moment of conception through natural death. After all, if we believe that every person is created in the image and likeness of God and made for eternal life, we must defend life at all stages. Some politicians who call themselves Catholic but support legal abortion are a source of shame for us all.

Soon a new pro-life billboard sponsored by St. Lawrence and Sacred Heart will go up near Exit 2 on I-84 to send a message to the millions of drivers who pass by every month. We're looking for more ways we can expand our support for crisis pregnancy centers and maternity homes that support women in the courageous choices they need to make when facing an unplanned pregnancy.



I'm convinced that in fifty or a hundred years when people look back, they will wonder what was wrong with our society that allowed the killing of a million unborn babies a year in the name of "reproductive freedom." And they will see that the Catholic Church led the way to building a culture of life with thousands of crisis pregnancy centers which gradually turned the tide on the culture of death. Take a look at Archbishop Coakley's article from the Wall Street Journal, reprinted in this bulletin, for more insight.

Thank you for all your support for our Brewster Cares Day Camp, which kicks off four weeks of fun on Monday. We'll have 55 kids from the South Bronx and Yonkers parishes enjoying the fields and gym at Sacred Heart – kids whose families find it hard to get out of the inner city. They'll also get fun religious instruction daily. Thanks to your amazing generosity, the camp is run totally on scholarships.

For our local kids, we have basketball and soccer camp coming up in August here at St. Lawrence... sign up your kids for a great fun experience with our experts the last two weeks before back to school.





## a catholic's duty in post-roe america

'If you are pregnant and in need, come to the Catholic Church." The late Cardinal John O'Connor spoke these words more than 30 years ago, when he founded the Sisters of Life, a Catholic pro-life religious order in New York. His remark was a welcoming call to expecting mothers with nowhere to turn and a plea to the American church to act as guardians to all of God's children. O'Connor's words rang true then and are perhaps even more important now.

The church in America stands on the precipice of a new beginning. On June 24, the Supreme Court struck down the infamous precedent Roe v. Wade, returning the question of abortion to state governments and to the hearts and minds of all Americans.

Reversing Roe represented a necessary first step to bring about a culture of life, from conception to natural death, and end a culture of abortion and death. The court's decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization will save many lives and help to affirm human dignity at all stages of development. But the demise of Roe is, as Churchill put it, only the end of the beginning.

It also is a reminder of our duty as Catholics. By virtue of our baptism, we are called to see Christ in every human life, and to work and pray for a society in which laws reflect the inherent dignity of the human person. This commitment requires us to create alternatives to abortion and ultimately to make it unthinkable. The end of Roe challenges us anew to open our hearts, and our doors, to mothers and children in need through foster care and adoption—to what Pope Francis called "the highest form of love, and of fatherhood and motherhood."

A year ago the high court unanimously protected Catholic ministries that serve vulnerable children in need of loving foster and adoptive homes. In Fulton v. City of Philadelphia, the justices ensured that Catholic Social Services, serving in the heart of inner-city Philadelphia, can fulfill its foster-care

ministry in accordance with the faith that animates its mission. Fulton was a major victory for religious liberty and for people of faith across America. But it was also a clarion call for the church to redouble its millennia-old service to the most vulnerable among us.

Before the decision in Fulton, several Catholic foster-care and adoption ministries in the U.S.—including in California, Illinois, Massachusetts, New York and the District of Columbia—closed their doors when local and state governments demanded they endorse same-sex relationships. By ending decades of service to those most in need, they left untold numbers of children without a loving foster home and potentially missing out on the blessing of adoption.

It is time for dioceses across the country to reopen and reinvigorate these life-affirming ministries to serve children in need. It is imperative that we as Catholics answer this call with enthusiasm, not only to ease our nation's foster-care crisis, but to provide good soil for expecting mothers in a post-Roe America.

For decades, our country has viewed abortion as a solution to a problem, a quick fix for an unwanted burden. Catholics must resolve to undermine this deeply antihuman premise. Words and statements aren't enough. We must attend to our society's most vulnerable through our actions and our ministries. We must help mothers and children in need, and we must encourage our brothers and sisters in Christ to do the same.

In Fulton, the Supreme Court vindicated the right of Catholic foster and adoption services to continue their ministry in accordance with their faith. It is now time to embrace this freedom with full force. Supporting life-affirming ministries like crisis pregnancy centers and foster and adoption agencies is an excellent start. All Catholic dioceses, churches, schools, families and individuals are essential in this effort.

Working together in faith and confidence, our Catholic communities, in every state in this union, can restore America's dedication to treasuring the miracle of life.



# why you shouldn't miss sunday mass on summer vacation

When traveling away from home to enjoy a relaxing time of vacation, it can be tempting to "forget" to attend Mass on Sunday. We may want to sleep in on Sunday, or there might not be a convenient Mass time and we don't want to interrupt our activities.

Whatever excuse we may come up with, vacation seems much simpler if we skip the Sunday obligation.

#### HOWEVER, GOD DOESN'T SEE IT THIS WAY.

The current Code of Canon Law confirms the Sunday obligation and states, "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, *the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass*."

This means that any Catholic who is able to attend Mass must make every reasonable effort to be there.

At times there may be exceptional circumstances that could dispense a person from attending Mass. For example, if the town you're traveling to doesn't have a Catholic parish, it would be unreasonable to expect you to find a Mass. But opting to skip an available Mass in favor of *enjoying time on the beach is not a legitimate reason to miss Sunday Mass*.

#### **TIME FOR GOD**

The reason why the Church is so insistent on this issue is that we need to make time for God on Sundays, worshiping in the way that he designed.

St. John Paul II urged all Catholics to renew their dedication to the Sunday Eucharist in his apostolic letter, Dies Domini.

It is crucially important that all the faithful should be convinced that they cannot live their faith or share fully in the life of the Christian community unless they take part regularly in the Sunday Eucharistic assembly. The Eucharist is the full realization of the worship which humanity owes to God, and it cannot be compared to any other religious experience. A particularly efficacious expression of this is the Sunday gathering of the entire community, obedient to the voice of the Risen Lord who calls the faithful together to give them the light of his word and the nourishment of his Body as the perennial sacramental wellspring of redemption. The grace flowing from this wellspring renews mankind, life and history.

While it may be easier to skip Mass on Sunday when traveling, we would be sacrificing the wellspring of grace that God wants to give to us in every Sunday Eucharist.

Above all, don't see the obligation to Sunday Mass as an imposition, but as an invitation to a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ.

Women were not only given the opportunity to associate with and learn from Jesus, but just as the men were, they were also told that knowing Jesus, his words, and his Kingdom was the primary concern.

#### TIME TO SEE



When I was away at my art retreat, a classmate relayed an insightful story that I want to share with you. When Regina was seven years old, she experienced a very vivid dream. She was on the school playground; when she looked across the yard, she saw Jesus standing there watching the children play. She turned to her

friend and said, "Look, there is Jesus!" Her friend replied that she didn't see Him. She turned to another friend and said the same, but that girl didn't see Him either. Then Jesus walked across the playground, sat down on the curb, and continued to watch the children. Regina walked over and sat next to Him. She looked up and asked, "Jesus, why can't they see you?"

He replied, "Because it isn't their time yet."

Regina is in her mid-fifties now, and that experience is just as vivid as if she received it yesterday. She is comforted by that divine message, especially that Jesus suggests that one day her friends will see Him too. Recently the Holy Spirit has been allowing her to see Jesus, Mary, and other sacred images in nature and she has been able to translate those visions into profoundly moving sculptures. She isn't an experienced artist, but creating these beautiful works has been effortless to her. That is a supernatural sign that God is working through her, it isn't her efforts alone. She has kept her eyes open and responded to the Spirit's promptings. She has no idea where this will lead. She is waiting for further direction.

She showed me photos of her inspiration, and I can't see what she sees. I would never have been able to create her very detailed artwork from those images. My eyes are open, but the Holy Spirit is revealing different things to me. He is revealing things to you too. Can you see them? Imagine if every human being opened their eyes and was able to see what Jesus has planned for them? For most of us it isn't, artwork, but it is something that can only be executed effortlessly by the person conceived for that purpose. If Regina had not been willing to see, her statues wouldn't have existed, and the world would be a little less beautiful.

**Scripture**: Read Isaiah 32:3. What stands out? **Call to Action**: Pray to Jesus that this be your time. Ask Him to allow you to see what He has uniquely planned for you to do.
