

Dear Friends,

October is always a good month for weddings, and this month we're happy to celebrate six couples tying the knot here at St. Lawrence! It's great to see that there are young people who, in the middle of the culture they've grown up in – in so many ways cynical about commitment and life-long love – nevertheless still believe that love will last and they step forward publicly and bind themselves to each other. Millennials and Gen Z people are supposed to be free-spirited and allergic to commitment. But marriage is the number one commitment most people make their entire lives. These couples aren't afraid to be counter-cultural.



It's also something significant that they come to the Church and celebrate their vows to each other in the House of God, in front of the tabernacle and the presence of Jesus. They are aware that by doing so, they are calling upon God to bless them and be with them by his grace. Because the commitment they make to each other is not just a human commitment, but something divine, and so "therefore, what God has joined together, let no one put asunder."

For God, his bride is the Church. For us Christians, the love of a husband and wife are a reflection of the total self-giving love of God for his Church in an unbreakable commitment we call a "covenant".

For us Catholics, getting married before a justice of the peace or in a wedding venue is wrong, because establishing a marriage is a Sacrament. Catering halls and country clubs make it easy to do, and they set up pretty gardens and little chapels to make it nice. But they don't have God there, and that's what young couples need most... more than flowers and fancy settings.



UNITED IN MYSTERY

October 7th was the **Feast Day of Our Lady of the Rosary**. On that day, we celebrate the defeat of the Ottoman Empire in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The Turkish forces were very powerful, but the Christians won due to the intercession of Mary and the prayer of the Most Holy Rosary. Century after century, stories accrue from miracles that occur as a result of the faithful praying the Rosary. Miracles are happening today.

Some people easily gravitate to this meditative form of prayer. Caressing the beads and repeating the prayers is simple and relaxing. I have been praying the Rosary daily for a few years, but it didn't come easily to me at first. What turned that all around was falling in love with the Mysteries of the Rosary.

Contemplating the mysteries helps me relate to Jesus and Mary and dig deeper into these important Gospel stories. There are many books to guide us in contemplating the mysteries, but I prefer now to use my own imagination, making it very personal. For instance,

when contemplating Mary's Annunciation, the first of the Joyful Mysteries, we may meditate on what Mary might have thought when Angel Gabriel invited her to take on the history-changing role of God's mother. But I might contemplate my own annunciation experiences. What unique roles has God asked me to do? How did I respond? What was the outcome?

The first Sorrowful Mystery is Jesus' Agony in the Garden before his passion. When people I know are awaiting surgery, I compare their agony of waiting with Jesus' agony; it helps me recognize their suffering as redemptive and it is comforting to know that Jesus understands their anxiety and pain. Each of the mysteries can become personal if we find commonalities with our own lives. They draw us deeper into the Gospel message, help us grow in intimacy with Jesus and Mary and validate that our own life experiences are meaningful too.

Scripture: Luke 22:41-44. What commonality can you find? Call to Action: Say at least one decade of the Rosary a day: 1 Our Father and 10 Hail Marys and contemplate one of the Mysteries. Learn more: usccb.org/how-to-pray-the-rosary
