while we're at it

Dear Friends,

Do you know what theme Jesus talks about more than any other in all the Gospels? No, it's not the Ten Commandments, or the Pharisees, or even about Heaven. Guess... You'll be surprised to know it's about money.

That's right – Jesus talks about money about 17 times. He understood that money itself was not the problem, but as he says, "the desire for money is the root of all evil." Wealth itself is neutral but it is our use of it that matters. The desire for more and more of it can corrupt us and twist our conscience, warping it with greed and envy, and leading to the loss of souls. People put it before God, and "you cannot serve both God and money." Money can be a trap if we don't use it wisely as God tells us to use it.

It's why in the Old Testament God told the Israelites to tithe, that is, to give the first 10% back to God and live on the remaining 90%. In truth, all material things are God's, and we are just stewards of what he has created.

Tithing makes us aware of the proper relationship we should have to material things – entrusted with their good use, but not really to do with them just anything we please.

That's why the rich will be judged more severely depending on how they used their wealth - did they help the poor and those suffering? Or did they squander it on indulgences and luxuries? Sometimes we see that the richest people give away only a tiny percentage of their money. "Woe to them." Jesus says it is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven.

For most of us in the middle, we also have responsibilities to use what we have for God, for his Church, to give others a better chance at salvation, to restore the dignity of the poor, and the homeless, to help the sick and suffering, and so on. We can get greedy and selfish just like the rich, but maybe on a smaller scale.

We should all strive to give away that first 10% for the works of God and trust him to help us live on the 90%. Those who do that never go hungry; they find that God provides for them and they have all they need. And they have the peace of soul knowing they have their priorities right.

How about you? Do you give to God first or do you give him the leftovers when you've taken care of everything else first? Take this one to prayer.

eternal grace

Sitting in church last Tuesday, waiting for Helen Rozzi's funeral to begin, I found myself asking God what my funeral will be like one day. Will I live into my 100s with my children and close family and friends predeceasing me? If I die next week, will people travel and take time off of work? Will I die suddenly or after a prolonged illness? God in his wisdom didn't give me any answers; maybe they are of minor importance. He reminded me, however, of what is of major importance.

Several years ago, when my Uncle Bob was dying, he instructed his four children not to have a funeral Mass. He just wanted his family and friends to gather at the fire hall, drink beer, and tell funny stories. He was raised Catholic; his children received their sacraments, but their faith was not an important part of their lives. Since they had a broken relationship with the

Church, his sons and daughters didn't question his wishes. It felt to me that Uncle Bob was telling God that he didn't need Him.

I couldn't help but recognize the stark contrast between Uncle Bob's send-off to the beautiful tributes for Helen Rozzi, Gerry Green, and Kathy Pellecchia, three long-time parishioners whose funerals I attended recently. Their families brought their wives and mothers, husband and father to the church that was home to them, filled with parishioners that loved them, officiated by a priest that knew them personally. The families chose Scripture readings and hymns that were meaningful and gave the rest of us the privilege of uniting our prayers for their loved ones with theirs in the holy sacrifice of the Mass.

For a Catholic, a Mass of Christian Burial is essential. What happens in that holy space cannot be accomplished in a fire hall or funeral home. It is coming together before God in his house, to worship, appeal for his mercy, and intercede for the soul of the deceased. And it can take the sting of death away for the rest of us, as we confidently give our loved ones to God, knowing He is the One who loved them first.

Scripture: Read Wisdom 3:5-9. What stands out? **Call to Action**: More important than planning for retirement is planning for eternity. Make sure you and your loved ones receive the graces that only a funeral Mass can provide.
