

while we're at

Dear Friends.

December is the darkest month of the year with the days getting shorter and nights longer until Dec. 21, when the Northern Hemisphere most faces away from the sun. The arrival of Christmas begins to renew our hope, and the light gradually creeps back. It's an apt metaphor for our culture. We go from dark to darker unless we welcome Jesus as "the light of the world."

Until we do, the darkness spreads.

A friend sent me an article about a French priest silenced by his bishop because he preached that abortion has killed more people in France than all who died in World War I. It's an obvious fact. Why are we afraid to face the hard truths of our day and call things by their name?



As we helped St. Anthony of Padua feed 800 homeless in the South Bronx on Thanksgiving Day, we got tragic news as we were offering Mass. A homeless immigrant mom with three small children despaired and took her own life... the third suicide in a city homeless shelter in a week. We just don't have solutions for all these displaced people who arrive so traumatized.

Tomorrow night we open our **Brewster Cares sleep center** and daytime **warming station** for the homeless. Last year we helped 33 adults with various different issues of addiction, mental health problems, and poverty – as the Gospel teaches us to do. Thank you for your constant, generous help to give these folks some dignity and respect. But what is it about our society that keeps breeding more broken people?

There is even controversy here in our town now about the high school permitting teachers to discuss gender theory and sex with underage kids, similar to what is happening around the country. Seems many have lost common sense regarding education and the rights of parents to form their own children in their moral values.

Jesus Christ is the light of the world. Let's open the door for him and let him in. He will show us the way and bring the light of truth to our confusion.

Sign up for the Parish Mission with Deacon Bob Rice. It is the start of light coming back. It starts tonight -Sunday, December 4, and continues Monday and Tuesday. It will be powerful and life-changing for us all. Don't miss it.

serving the homeless on thanksgiving

This is only year three, but our trip to **St. Anthony of Padua Church on Thanksgiving morning** to help pack meals for the homeless, has become a tradition that we look forward to each year. Lots of familiar faces from St. Lawrence O'Toole and Sacred Heart, along with some new faces, made up our team of 31 eager workers.

The team of parishioners from St. Anthony's demonstrated amazing organizational skills and also knew how to be flexible and adjust to changes, such as the last-minute addition of 300 more meals to prepare. They made it look effortless and it ran like clockwork, but it was an incredible amount of work. We were happy to help, but they were the true heroes of this initiative, serving a total of 800 meals this year.

Once the food was packaged and ready to be loaded onto the vans, we worshipped together at Mass. Bishop Joseph Espaillat presided, assisted by our own Father Rich. A Mass on Thanksgiving Day is a joyful celebration, where we thank God for the many blessings he has bestowed on us. Bishop Joe reminded us that

each of the meals we packaged, represented a person whose life struggles we most likely cannot even imagine. His words were powerful, as he reminded us of the daily difficulties people experience, particularly those in the homeless shelters, and the toll that it takes on the workers who



dedicate themselves to serving them. I'm paraphrasing, but he left us with a thought-provoking challenge: "What can we do to really make a change in this world?"

helping the homebound at thanksgiving





BRILLIANCE

As I sat in Mass last Sunday, I started reflecting on the light that comes from the action of lighting the Advent Wreath. Imagine that you live in a pitch-dark room. One day you find a candle and light it. The room isn't dark anymore! One small light makes a big difference. You start to see some details of the table where the candle sits, and the room feels cozier. You have a feeling of hope that you never had living in darkness.

A week later, you notice the second candle and use the first to light it. Twice as much light. It radiates further, and you can see slightly beyond the table. The light reflects off of some other things in the room. You can't tell what they are, but you begin to recognize that the room is more interesting than you originally thought. It feels safer. Faith and trust are growing within you. In another seven days, a third candle catches your eye, and you

light it. The furniture around the room takes shape and you find that you trip less. Your days are more productive. You feel a joy that you didn't have before. Then a week later, you notice the fourth candle and wonder why you had never thought to light that one too. Now the room is alive with candlelight. You see beautiful paintings on the wall, photos on shelves, and tabletops. Peace and a sense of belonging envelop you like they never could when you lived in darkness.

What could be better than that, you ask? Life has changed radically: from darkness to light. The world is good, and you are happy. But a week later, on December 25th, there is a knock on your door. A friend walks into your room and asks why you are satisfied living in candlelight. He walks to the wall, flips the switch, and turns on the spectacular crystal chandelier that hangs in the center of your room. You are awed by its brilliance. Once your eyes adjust, you see your room with perfect clarity; such a contrast to the darkness you previously accepted and the candlelight that had impressed you.

Jesus is the light of the world. He defeats darkness and reveals all the cobwebs hanging in our corners. Let us use this Advent to build up our hope, faith, joy, and peace, as each candle is lit so that we are prepared to receive the full gift of light that Jesus longs to give us at Christmas.

Scripture: Read John 8:12. What stands out? **Call to Action**: Pray for Jesus to help you grow in faith so that this Christmas is the most brilliant one you have ever known.
