



OUR GLORIOUS FRIEND

I have been continuing to think about last Sunday's Gospel, the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. What resonates with me is the way that Martha and Mary spoke to Jesus and their attitude toward Him. When each of them met Jesus separately, they said the exact same words: "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." They knew that everyone died at some point, why did they think that their brother should be exempt? Because Jesus was their friend?

Father Rich has spoken to us on the misguided prosperity gospel message of some ministers. They teach that if we love Jesus and are faithful enough, then we won't suffer, and our lives will be happy, healthy, and prosperous. As Catholics, we believe that God allows suffering to bring a greater good, and I believe that this Gospel illustrates that doctrine and blows the whole prosperity gospel premise to smithereens.

Lazarus and his sisters were some of Jesus' closest friends. Yet, when Jesus got Martha and Mary's message that Lazarus was sick, we are told that "he remained for two days in the place where he was." Lazarus was suffering from his illness, and his sisters were suffering out of compassion and worry. Jesus allowed them to experience all of it. He didn't even go immediately to show his support. He was intentionally absent. We learn that He intends to help them, but he does it his way and on his timeline.

When Jesus finally arrived in Bethany, he gave both sisters the opportunity to express their disappointment and frustration. Then He used the situation to elevate their faith. Look at his conversation with Martha and the ultimate question he asks her: "...everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She responds, "I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God..." Think of this story when Jesus isn't answering your prayers as quickly as you would like. He may want to use the opportunity to elevate your faith; He may be allowing you to suffer for a little while. He may be repeating to you his last words to Martha, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?"

Scripture: Read John 11:1-7. What stands out? **Call to Action**: Reflect back on past sufferings and ask Jesus to reveal the way he used them for good.

Recently, Fr. Bobby Carolan, Associate at the Annunciation -Our Lady of Fatima Church, Crestwood, NY spoke on **The Eucharistic Life in St. John Paul II** at our **Seasons of Praise** Holy Hour.

Fr. Carolan spoke fondly of Pope John Paul II, who ordained our pastor, Fr. Gill. He detailed the Pope's journey to pontiff and sainthood. Pope John Paul II said, "The secret of my life is the Eucharist - Christ's presence on earth. It gives strength and meaning to all I do." Fr. Carolan continued, "When John Paul II became Pope, it was his goal to spread perpetual adoration throughout the world. In 1981, he made a perpetual adoration chapel at the Vatican, spending two hours daily in Adoration. 'Jesus is not an idea. Jesus is a person, always alive and with us." Fr. Carolan shared how he heard it was difficult to keep Pope John Paul II on schedule as he stopped and prayed each time he was before the Eucharist. During one visit, his advisers closed all the church's interior doors in order that the Pope would not know which door led to the Chapel. As the Pope walked the church's hallway, he stopped, wagged his finger, and shook his head to his advisors. He opened a door leading to the Chapel, knelt, and prayed before the Eucharist.

Pope John Paul II knew the belief in Jesus' true presence in the Eucharist was declining. Today approximately 40% of baptized Catholics look at it as a symbol. Fr. Carolan said, "The Eucharist transforms us. It feeds us on our journey to heaven. Pope John Paul II said, 'It is the source and summit of Christian Life."

It was Fr. Carolan's words on the Offertory that touched me. "At the time of the Offertory, offer your intentions. This is why Catholics go to Mass. It is not a service. Take your cross and unite it with the Lord's. You put yourself on the paten and in the Chalice by your intentions. Pope John Paul II knew the power of Mass and the Eucharist."

Fr. Carolan asked that we "Let Jesus' presence in the Sacrament speak to our heart. God has his day, the devil has his hour. That is why we do a Holy Hour, to revert the evil of the world."

The Prince of Peace taught us how to pray. Pope John Paul II prayed for perpetual adoration, which we have here at St. Law-rence. Jesus told his apostles to go out into the world and bring people to him. As disciples, he depends on us to do the same.

Fr. Carolan concluded, "That hunger, that everyone is searching for – that perfect light, that perfect truth, that perfect love, is right there (pointing to the Eucharist). God is the only one to satisfy our hearts," Pope John Paul II made Christ loveable to all who believe. Adore him.
