

November 12, 2023 while we're at it

Dear Friends,

This week we've held meetings with the nearly 200 parishioners who do weekly adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel. We wanted to get everyone together to thank them for their interest in growing closer to God in prayer, and to thank God for making possible this amazing devotion and all the fruits it has borne for our parish and the Church.

People spoke of how they have grown in the love of God and in peace of soul, of the miracles of grace they have experienced in their lives and in the lives of people they pray for. It's undeniable that a person who commits to an hour a week before the Blessed Sacrament receives powerful graces and an answer to their prayers from the Lord.



I pointed out that since we started **Perpetual Adoration** (that means 24/7/365), we have seen so many fruits in our parish and beyond, such as:

- Long Confession lines every Monday and Friday from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm with 80-90 people going weekly.
- An increase in the number of children enrolling in religious education, while the number of kids in the local school district is actually declining.
- A 50% increase in offertory collections that enable us to grow our parish and be financially stable.
- Sponsoring two new non-profit organizations: **Brewster Cares** for the poor, the homeless, and the immigrant community, and **Gianna's House** Pregnancy Resource Center for women facing unexpected pregnancies.
- Renovation of our beautiful Church and grounds and staying on track to pay down our loans on time by 2025.

And these are just some of the external things we can measure and see. The interior fruits in souls and the improvements in people's families and relationships, their ability to cope with sickness, suffering, separation – all are graces we can't see but which individuals experience for real in their hearts. And those are the most important fruits God is giving us all.

We have many hundreds of other people who while they can't commit to a fixed hour each week, nonetheless drop in for ten or twenty minutes while running errands or on the way home from work. You're invited to do that anytime.

Maybe it's time for you to take your own hour too – we'd like to have at least two adorers every hour, so there is plenty of space... check it out at **stlawrenceotoole.org/adoration**

St. John Macias, a friend of St. Martin de Porres, is often depicted "stealing" souls from purgatory with his rosary.

A Dominican layman from the 16th century, St. John Macias was friends with St. Martin de Porres and helped him in his daily duties.

The **Nashville Dominicans** offer a brief explanation of his primary duties.

One of Juan Macias' chief duties was to **meet the poor** who came to **the convent seeking material or spiritual assistance**, often more than 200 people every day. Besides his cheerful disposition and encouraging manner, Juan Macias became known for the sometimes miraculous nature of his service to the poor. Everyone knew that Juan worked extremely hard to collect alms for distribution. Still, he would often return empty handed. Yet, somehow Juan never turned anyone away. Furthermore, his friendship with St. Martin de Porres, another Dominican saint, would eventually lead to a joint beatification ceremony.

The two saints often met on their daily rounds of the city and became close spiritual friends as well. They were a constant source of encouragement and ideas for one another. **The two were beatified together in a single ceremony by Pope Gregory XVI in 1837.**

During his life, St. John Macias would frequently pray for the souls in purgatory with his rosary, as the *Confraternity of Intercessors for the Souls in Purgatory* explains on their website.

The iconography represents St. John Macias freeing the souls of purgatory with the rosary. The saint always carried the rosary that his mother left him as an inheritance. **Because of his constant praying of the Rosary for the souls in purgatory, his biographers call him the "thief of purgatory."**

His example reminds us of the need to pray for souls in purgatory and the power of intercessory prayer.

ELEVATED VOCABULARY

Recently, I have become very conscious of word choices. Certain words are nagging at me, causing me to ponder their contemporary uses compared to their original meanings. What especially bothers me are words that have beautiful, rich definitions, but have been diluted to the point of worthlessness.

I think the word "good," is the most tragic victim of present-day word neutering. "Good" is so overused and weakened that it is bland and meaningless. The Webster Dictionary has the first definition as, "morally excellent; virtuous, righteous," yet every mass murderer's mother will tell reporters that her son was a good boy. Jesus revealed his high standard for good by saying, "No one is good except God alone," yet most people will claim that they expect to go to heaven because "I am a good person."

Rather than considering ourselves and others good, can we replace "good" with "virtuous" or "righteous?" Can you say, "I am trying to be a virtuous person," or "He is a righteous person."? These words are not commonly used, so they get our attention and have power. In fact, saying, "I am trying to be a virtuous woman," provides a very different understanding than saying a "virtuous person," doesn't it? By stating that, I would be saying that I am trying to exhibit the virtues expected of a woman. To say, "He is a righteous man," tells us that he is holding himself to the high standards of manhood. Labeling ourselves as persons dilutes our identity even further.

Two other words that nag me are "awesome" and "adorable." A prayer that I say every morning describes God as adorable and it awakened me to the true meaning of that word: "worthy of being adored." With "adore" meaning: "to regard with the utmost esteem, love, and respect." "Awesome" is supposed to mean, "inspiring awe." While "awe" means: "an overwhelming feeling of reverence, admiration, fear, produced by that which is grand, sublime, extremely powerful." Two beautiful words currently being used to elevate frivolous things to levels only worthy of God. I will never use adorable or awesome to describe cute puppies and party dresses again.

Scripture: Read Matthew 19:17. What stands out? **Call to Action**: Stay watchful with your vocabulary and save words like good, adorable, and awesome for God who deserves them.
